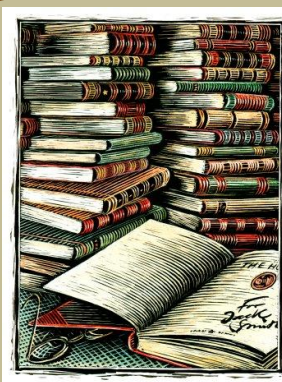
New Faculty
