
Brown Foundation Grant




Karen Hebert takes her honor students on a field trip to Eastside Primary School near Hammond, where about 90% of the students are living below the poverty level, and we share a reading experience. The SPS student reads with his buddy and dedicates it to the child. The grant money is used to buy literacy gifts for kids, bags with pens, pencils, notebooks, etc. This project helps the kids to have things they need, it helps our children see how blessed they are and teaches them to give back to community. The eighth grade honors classes par-

ticipate in the Brown Foundation Service Learning Grant Program twice a year. They look at examples of early reading texts and decide on a subject they would like to write about. Each book has text, coloring pages and jokes on the 1 st grade level. They are written, illustrated, edited and printed. In the fall they do alphabet books and in spring they do non-fiction books related to social studies or science.
