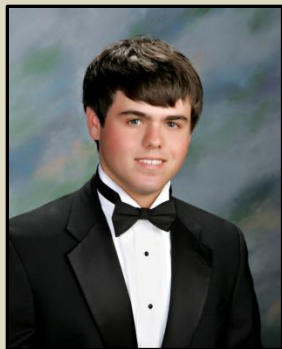

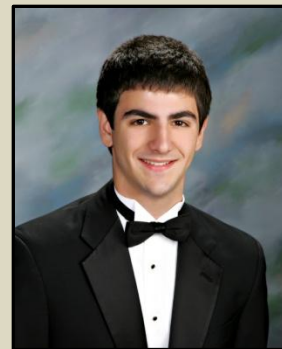

Colin Babcock '10 – Colin has qualified for the Olympic team trials in swimming. Colin has completed his freshman year at Notre Dame.

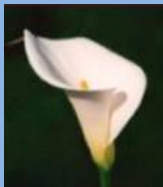

8th Grade Graduation

Saint Paul's School administration, faculty, and families of eighth graders gathered in the Student Center to congratulate the 175 students who completed their first year of required course work. Brother Raymond Bulliard, FSC, Principal of Saint Paul's served as Master of Ceremonies for the evening with Brother Ken Boesch, FSC and Mr. Charles Legendre, Campus Minister providing the music for the prayer service. Trevor Watkins, Assistant Principal, announced the names of the academic award winners and candidates for promotion.

The program began with the traditional Saint Paul's opening hymn, Rise Up, O Men of God and the Reading from The Book of Samuel, done by Colin Hanley, Burke Irwin, William Kenyon, and Hunter Simonson discussing the Lord calling Samuel to service. Colin, William and Hunter were selected for the outstanding awards in the Foreign Language Festival, and Burke won first place in the Xavier University School of Theology Essay Contest. The eighth grade class sang the responsorial psalm, Here I Am Lord. College Tour 2011

In early June twenty-nine of Saint Paul's rising juniors and seniors visited

eight colleges on the annual College Tour, which is sponsored by the Saint Paul's Renaissance Board. The tour began on Monday morning when the bus departed the Saint Paul's campus for the University of Mississippi in Oxford, Mississippi. The boys spent the evening exploring the town, getting a glimpse into the social side of college life. On Tuesday morning, the group toured Ole Miss, viewing the campus, and the famous "Walk of Champions." After lunch on campus, the bus left for Starkville, Mississippi, and Mississippi State University. Everyone was treated to an air-conditioned bus tour and information session. The day ended with a ride to Jackson, Mississippi, where the group stayed for the night.

The next morning began with a tour of Millsaps College, the smallest college on this year's tour with only about 1,100 students. The tour was led by Ben Morvant, a 2004 graduate of St. Paul's and a 2008 graduate of Millsaps. The next stop on the trip was a tour of Louisiana Tech in Ruston, Louisiana, that afternoon. From Millsaps the bus traveled to Ruston, Louisiana where we had an information session and tour of Louisiana Tech. The boys then boarded the bus again for the long ride to Dallas, Texas, where the night was spent at the Hotel Lumen, directly across the street from SMU.

On Thursday morning, the group walked across the street for a tour of Southern Methodist University. After dining in SMU's cafeteria for lunch and a short bus ride to Fort Worth, Texas, the boys learned about the "Horned Frog" during a tour of Texas Christian University. The day ended with another long bus ride, this time to Austin, Texas, where everyone was treated to a little karaoke entertainment from senior Brandon de la Houssaye, who performed the 1989 hit "Ice Ice Baby."

Friday morning began early with a tour of the enormous University of Texas at Austin. With close to 51,000 students, it was the largest university the group toured this year. After a quick lunch in Austin, the group headed for College Station, Texas, and the final stop of this year's tour at Texas A & M University. After an in-depth information session and short tour, the group began its trek home, stopping for the night in Houston, Texas at the Westin Galleria Hotel. Many of the boys enjoyed dinner and tried their hands at ice skating in the Galleria, while others simply enjoyed the relaxation of the hotel pool and the mall. After a week of learning about what lies ahead for them in college, the boys arrived at Saint Paul's on Saturday afternoon with a plethora of information they will undoubtedly use when they make decisions about where they want to continue their education after Saint Paul's in addition to the multitude of clothes, foam fingers, and other souvenirs.
