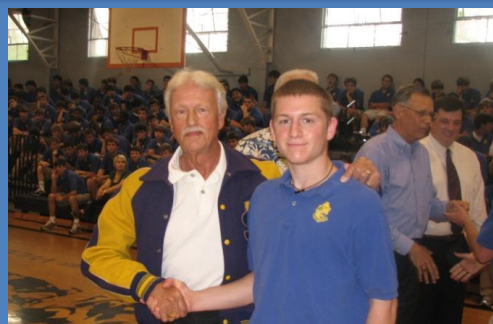

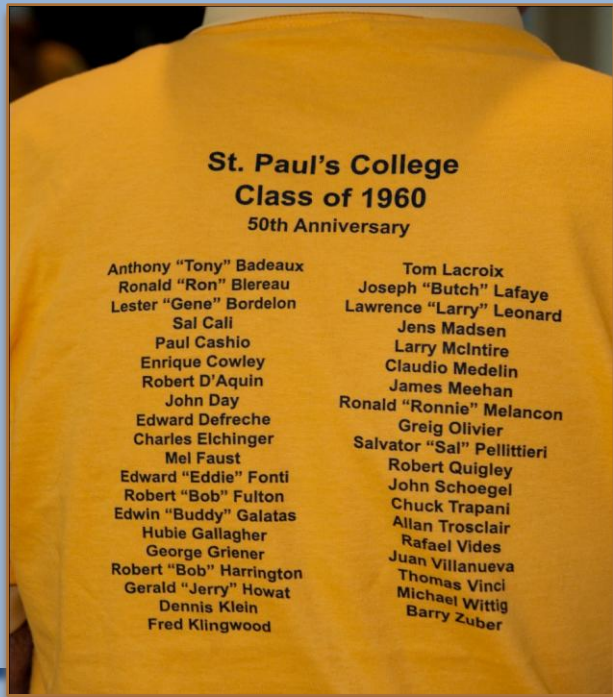

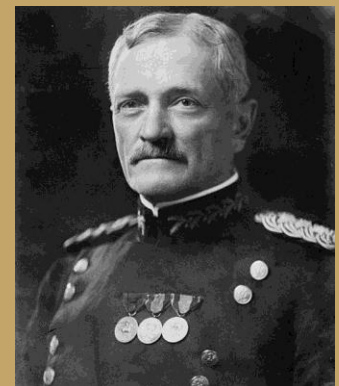

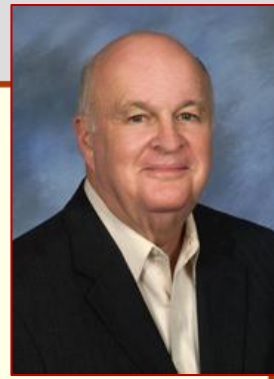

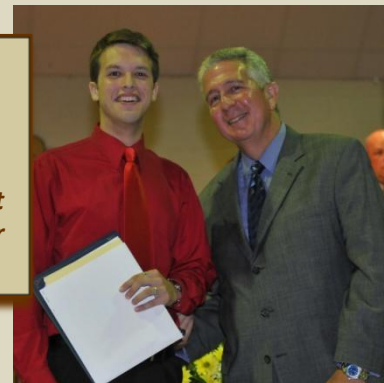

Athletic Director, Craig Ketelsen, opened the program with a prayer, and Colonel Joseph Reich led the Pledge of Allegiance. 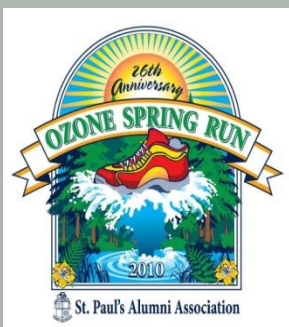
