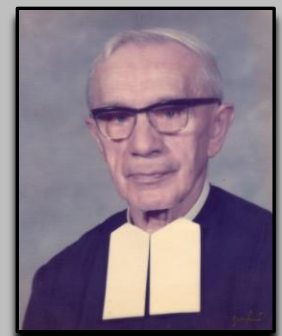

Athletic Awards

Saint Paul's administration, faculty, student body and parents gathered in the Briggs Assembly Center to present the major sports awards for the 2012-13 school term. Over 600 students participated in at least one sport during the year. The various teams garnered eight district titles, one metro title, two regional championships, two parish titles, three state runners-up titles, and three state championships this year. Forty-one athletes were included on all-district teams including, two Most Valuable Players. Fourteen student-athletes were members of the All-Metro teams including two Most Valuable Players, and twelve athletes earned the title of Parish Champion, with one Most Valuable Player. Twenty-nine students were All-State or State Champions breaking several school and state records. Thirty-four seniors were honored for both their academic and athletic success by being named to the Academic All-State Teams. David Englehardt, Kenneth Garraway, Robert Klazynski, Collin Kersker, Jordan Peterson, and Ryan Martin were named to the LHSAA Composite All-State Academic Teams for their respective sports.

Fourteen student-athletes will continue their athletic careers in colleges and universities. Ben Anzlaone and Christopher Douglas will play baseball at Spring Hill. Logan Trent will play baseball at Delgado Community College. Connor Campo will wrestle at Wartburg College. Edward Duplessis and Jay Washington will play football at McNeese State University, Ryan Malone will play football at Kent State, and Christian Voelkel will play football at University of Louisiana at Lafayette. Peter Baricev will play lacrosse at Rhodes, and Matthew Lewis will play lacrosse at Pfeiffer University. Robert Klazynski will swim at Marymount University. Ryan Martin will play golf at Millsaps; Brandon Pierce will play golf at Louisiana State University, and Cameron Robichaux will pole vault at Louisiana State University. Outstanding seniors included: Blake Ricalde who earned three consecutive state championship titles as a powerlifter. Connor Campo earned two consecutive state championship titles in his wrestling career, and Marc Reagan earned two consecutive titles in his powerlifting career. David Thompson, and Gustavo Garcia earned state titles as seniors in powerlifting, and Cameron Robichaux was the state champion in pole vault for 2013 in both indoor and outdoor track. Eight members of the coaching staff were honored as district coaches of the year.

Athletic Director, Criag Ketelsen, served as Master of Ceremonies for the program welcoming guests and congratulating the school on the overall performance of the athletes over the year. His first duty was to congratulate all the young ladies from Saint Scholastica who served as cheerleaders; each was presented with the traditional yellow rose. Audrey Poole, cheerleader moderator, presented Saint Paul's with a state trophy earned by the cheerleaders at camp.

The next event on the program was to recognize the young men in grades eight, nine, ten and eleven who earned the Outstanding Student Athlete Award for not only their athletic abilities, but also for their dedication, character, and academic performance. Brad Marchese, assistant soccer coach, and senior Connor Campo presented Austin Means with the eighth grade award. Bill Babcock, swimming coach, with the assistance of Brandon Pierce, presented the ninth grade award to Harrison Prieto, a third generation student at Saint Paul's. Josh Harrelson, assistant football coach and senior Justin Elzy presented Jalen McCleskey with the award for the sophomore level. Zachary Albright received the award on the junior level from Al Nastasi, track coach, and senior Cameron Robichaux.
