The 1st meeting for the 28th Annual Ozone Spring Run will be held on Thursday, December 8th in the Alumni Office at 11:30am.






Centennial Club


What's New with You?

On Thursday, October 27th and Friday, October 28th, Saint Paul's was honored to host a special guest: Brother Álvaro Rodríguez Echeverría, the Superior General of the Brothers of the Christian Schools. Brother Alvaro, a native of Costa Rica, resides in Rome at the Motherhouse of the Brothers of the Christian Schools. As a facet of his position as Superior General, he conducts visits to the many districts throughout the eighty-two countries in which there are Lasallian schools. Consequently, Saint Paul's was one of his stops during his visit to the United States.

Brother's tour of the New Orleans-Santa Fe District began at J.K. Mullen High School in Denver on October 18, and he continued through Santa Fe, El Paso, and New Orleans before arriving in Covington on the morning of October 27th. Zachary Barnett, Bobby Bayer, Luke Bissel, Justin DiCharia, Gabe Emerson, Josh Frank, Austin Hummel, Jacob Luke, Andrew Mullet, Brian Schmitt, and Shawn-Wesley Skinner, leaders of the student body, served as tour guides and accompanied Brother Superior on a walking tour of the majestic, forty-acre campus. He enjoyed soaking in the learning culture in mythology, morality and math during classroom visits. After the tour, he joined the student body in the Student Center for a Liturgy of the Word. During the prayer service, he spoke to students and faculty about their distinct Lasallian identity and their role in a much larger Lasallian world. Being a very prayerful man himself, it was obvious that he felt at home at Saint Paul's.

On Friday, Brother took in more of the rich culture that abounds at Saint Paul's. The Marian Players performed scenes from their upcoming play, Mr. Roberts, for him in the Alumni Memorial Theatre, the oldest building on campus. Following such a dramatic event, his next stop was at the Eighth-Grade Retreat, which was happening concurrently in the Student Center. He visited with the eighth graders and participated in some of their group activities. He spoke with the entire eighth grade class about being Lasallian and the importance of prayer in their daily lives, and they thanked him with a standing ovation. Before lunch, Brother Álvaro and the eighth graders joined the rest of the faculty, staff, and Brothers in Hunter Stadium to form a human star. The star is an important symbol in the Lasallian world, with each of the points representing one of the Five Core Principles. Each of the five grade levels formed one point of the star, and the faculty and Brothers joined Brother Álvaro in the center of the star. He completed his afternoon with a luncheon at the Brothers' Residence on campus, and a boat tour of the Tchefuncte River. After his two busy days in Covington, Brother had nothing but positive remarks about his impressions of the school and he was assured that Saint Paul's was indeed fulfilling its duty in educating students in the Lasallian tradition.







Approximately 140 students are selected from thousands for the state band. The state band is scheduled to perform at the Louisiana Music Educator's Association annual conference in late November.

The national competition included nearly 1700 juniors, and the best were selected as "Outstanding Writers." The

musical selections to highlight a theme of social justice for the national Lasallian Heuther Conference held in Washington, D.C., on November 17, 2011. Through a variety of fundraisers and generous donations from both the SPS Mother's Club and the Saint Paul's Renaissance Board, 13 students traveled to our nation's capital for a three-day excursion that included the Heuther Conference prayer service, a college tour of Catholic University of America, and various sight-seeing adventures, including a V.I.P. tour of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. During the Basilica tour, students were allowed to test the acoustics of the largest Catholic church in the western hemisphere by singing both a capella on the floor of the upper church and accompanied by the expansive pipe organ in the choir loft. Three students were allowed to test their skills on the pipe organ, and all students were led several stories up a narrow spiral staircase where they were each allowed to ring the century-old church bells that can be heard for miles.
