Mark Richards Environmental Club Coastal Restoration



On Thursday Sept. 30th, 14 students of Mr. Mark Richards Environmental Science class volunteered to work with The Coalition to Restore Coastal Louisiana in restoring the marshes of the Big Branch National Wildlife Refuge in Lacombe. The group plugged the marsh with over 1,000 plants of Spartina altinaflora, a salt resistant cord grass, to help fortify the Lake Pontchartrain marshes against tidal surges and salt water intrusion. Egg Drop

Every year, Jim Robertson's physics class does an experiment called the 'Egg Drop'. The students are given a box of toothpicks (250) and two rubber bands with the understanding that no other materials can be used. The students are charged with creating a structure that will prevent the egg from breaking when it is dropped from varying heights. Additionally, the egg cannot be glued to the structure. The egg is placed in the structure right before the drop and is removed afterwards in order to be inspected. The grade is determined by the height at which the egg breaks. This exercise demonstrates that by



increasing the amount of time it takes the egg to come to a full stop when it reaches the ground, you reduce the force that acts on the egg from the ground. If the force is reduced enough, the egg will not break.
