The De La Salle Provincialate of the District of New Orleans – Santa Fe has moved from Lafayette to Covington, Louisiana. Its new location is 104 W. 11th Avenue, across the street from Saint Paul's School. Housed in a remodeled home that features four office spaces, a conference room, a kitchen, and backyard patio, the Provincialate serves as the administrative headquarters for the District and houses its Leadership Team: Brother Tim Coldwell, FSC, Visitor; Brother David Sinitiere, FSC, Auxiliary Visitor; Brother Peter Tripp, FSC, Director of Resource Management; Mr. Charlie Legendre, AFSC, Director for Lasallian Mission; Mr. Bob Carrejo, Director of Communications; and Mr. Mike McMurray, Business Manager. The Team also includes Brother Michael Livaudais, FSC, Director of Vocation Promotion, who works from the Brother Joe Porter Community and Archbishop Rummel High School, where he teaches Fine Arts.

All Provincialate operations are now based at the new location except for the NO-SF Archives and Research and the Lasallian Publications store, which will remain in Lafayette for the time being under the care of Brother Emmet Sinitiere, FSC, Brother Gregory Wright, FSC, and Ms. Stephanie Trahan, respectively.

## Echoes from the Past


Saint Paul's is home to many wonderful things: scholars and musicians, championship athletic teams, and two communities of Christian Brothers. What often happens hurrying across campus to class, a meeting, an athletic competition, or a fund raising event, is that we miss the plethora of monuments and memorials that call the campus home.

The following series of articles will be to give the visitors to campus an introduction to the memorials. We begin with Founders' Circle. It is set in the footprint of Dixon Hall, the dormitory destroyed by fire in the early 1980's. It was the home of Dixon Academy (1900-1909) and the oldest building on campus. The circle now is one of the first monuments visitors encounter. It consists of a statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus atop a pedestal and at its base a jasmine garden surrounded by brass plates embossed with the names of the three Benedictine Monks and more than a dozen Christian Brothers. Why Benedictine Monks? They purchased Dixon Academy from Dr. Dixon and renamed it Saint Paul's College after the Abbot Paul Schaub. They came from Saint Joseph Abbey in 1911 to start the "professional school" for the town of Covington.



Father Augustine Unser, OSB - Father Augustine was born on October 31, 1878 in Muggensturm, Baden, Germany. He was ordained a priest on November 26, 1903. On September 11, 1911, Father Augustine moved into Saint Paul's. Under his direction, Saint Paul's grew from nothing into a very well respected business college and became known statewide through its sports program. Father Augustine died on January 2, 1919 a victim of the Swine Flu epidemic of 1918-1919.



Father Aemilian Egler, OSB - Father Aemilian was born in 1881 in Ferdinand, Indiana. He came to Louisiana and entered Saint Joseph Priory, making his first profession on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception in 1903 at the recently erected Abbey. He was ordained on October 11, 1908. He taught in the seminary and directed a brass band. In 1911 Father Aemilian was sent to the newly acquired Saint Paul's School. He became pastor of Saint Peter's in Covington and in 1939 purchased a square of ground, equal to one and a half city blocks, facing Jefferson Ave. as the site for a proposed new church. The cornerstone for this new brick church was laid on July 7, 1940. Father Aemilian died in 1948.

Father Adalbert Svrcek, OSB - A native of Texas Father Adalbert was born on October 29, 1882. He entered the seminary at Gessen in its first class in 1895-1896. He joined Saint Joseph Priory and was ordained a priest on December 23, 1905. On September 11, 1911 he was sent to Saint Paul's with Fathers Augustine and Aemilian. He remained at Saint Paul's until 1918 when the Christian Brothers took over. After serving as pastor of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart in New Orleans until March 1958, Father Adalbert became the resident chaplain at Saint Paul's. He served there as a devoted chaplain to the Brothers and the boys until he retired to the Abbey in 1962. Father Adalbert died on September 8, 1964.

Major Boudreaux firmly believes that he would not be where he is today without our ROTC program which is the second oldest program in Louisiana and the only one in a private school. He left the student body with this thought: "I count the number of lives that I saved to be my best accomplishments. Service before self is a part of my code."





The Fighting Math Wolves led the charge while battling in individual and team competitions over various categories: Geometry, Algebra I and II, and Advanced Math. Equipped with nothing more than pencils and brains since calculators were forbidden, six wolves placed in the top six overall in their respective categories. Four freshmen excelled past expectations in Algebra I: Luke Avenel received second place, Ryan Meraux third place, Jacob Broussard fourth place, and Patrick Connolly sixth place. Two sophomores also finished in the top six: George Cazenavette received third place and Max Gold received sixth place. ## The Paper Wolf Goes Digital



Saint Paul's beloved school newspaper, *The Paper Wolf*, has gone digital starting this school year to save money and paper and bring school media into the digital age. The website for the online publication was created over the summer to replace the physical paper with a digital one. The creation of the new website, [www.thepaperwolf.com](http://www.thepaperwolf.com), was spearheaded by Assistant Principal Trevor Watkins who noted that it "significantly" reduces costs to the school as opposed to printing papers every month. "The advantages to the website outweigh printing on paper. It lets us reach more people, and it is permanent and archived, so anyone can find an article they need. Though it was a nice way to read up on the news around Saint Paul's with a newspaper in hand, printing hundreds of papers is not efficient price-wise, environmentally friendly, or viable for the school," said Watkins.

He also noted the benefits of being able to update the site more regularly. "It allows for quick news. If the Student Center collapsed today, it wouldn't be in the paper for a month and it'd be old news by then. Now, everyone can know what's going on, including parents," he said. Watkins did comment on some of the negative aspects of switching to an internet publication, however. "As someone who liked to relax and read the paper in the morning, it's upsetting to have to squint to read on a small screen instead. But, it's the same thing the Times-Picayune is doing. More and more newspapers are going digital, it just makes more sense to save money and paper."

The Running Wolves competed in the St. Joseph's Invitational on Saturday, October 6, at Highland Park. Against 263 runners and 37 total teams, we won first place by beating second place Episcopal High by 41 points. The 1-2-3 punch of Zachary Albright, Kraemer Jackson and D.C. Lipani finished 1st, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup> respectively in the varsity race. Matthew Wirt, Nicholas Taylor, and Spencer Albright all finished in the top 25 overall. The Junior High team finished 3<sup>rd</sup> with Patrick Napier, Colin Sullivan, Gregory Roy, Chase McDougall, and Cameron Gary finishing in the top 25.

The following week again at Highland Park in the famous Catholic High Invitational the Wolves ran a man down. Without number one runner Kraemer Jackson, the Wolves still finished a respectable 3<sup>rd</sup> place, only losing to the winning team by five points. Zachary Albright finished 3<sup>rd</sup>, D.C. Lipani 11<sup>th</sup>, and Matthew Wirt 25<sup>th</sup>. The Junior High team finished 2<sup>nd</sup> with 5 runners in the top 25.

Finally on Saturday, October 21, the Wolves traveled to Walker, Louisiana, to compete in the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Walker Shootout. Due to usual cool temperatures and a flat course, this meet is the biggest race held in Louisiana besides the State Meet. After the 311 runners crossed the finish line, the Wolves completed their biggest victory of the season. 6 of the 7 varsity runners broke 16 minutes for 3 miles, and Junior Zachary Albright who finished 3<sup>rd</sup> overall, broke the school record previously held by Jimmy Wiggins, son of Mrs. Wiggins, by 26 seconds with a 3 mile time of 14 minutes and 34 seconds. The Varsity team won with a landslide victory by beating 2<sup>nd</sup> place Jesuit by 64 points. The Junior High team won 1<sup>st</sup> place also with 5 runners finishing in the top 10.
