
Alumni News



Echoes of the Past



This edition brings us to a statue that keeps sentry over the boys in the break area. It the statue of the young Jesus and sits outside of Benilde Hall. We know this is Jesus from the items he holds - grapes and wheat, young wine and bread, if you will. The beardless boy Jesus is there to remind our own students that He too had to grow and mature into manhood. The Saint Paul's students are brought to this statue on two occasions: once in art class, and again during religion class during their sophomore year. In art, they produce the image on paper and are given a lesson on sacred art how the clues to their identity are carried in the figure's hands. For Religion they get a review of this but also get a lesson on the brass plaque in the pedestal. It reads: "Presented by J.G. Broggi and Son 1950". It seems this is a case of philanthropy of the Broggi's and not a result of a tragedy. The date also suggests that this is one of the oldest items on campus. In recent news this statue was one of many that was defaced by vandals but quickly cleaned and restored by caring students, parents, and alumni who saw to it that not only the statue but what it represents will not be undone and be maintained for generations to come.



School Opens!



“Help us do ordinary things extraordinarily well!”

The theme of the school year is an executive decision made by Brother Ray and Trevor Watkins. It is always something based on a basic principle of Lasallian pedagogy or values. Since Saint Benilde was the first Christian Brother to be canonized, his diligent work as a teacher is a great example to the faculty. It the true mission of a Lasallian faculty member not only to provide instruction in academic matters, but also to help provide for the salvation of the souls of the young men entrusted to their care. As stated by Saint La Salle in Meditation 178.1 “Your faith should be for you a light which guides you in all things, and a shining light for those whom you instruct, to lead them to heaven.”



**Saint Brother Benilde
Romançon**

Pierre Romançon was born in the village of Thuret in south-central France. He was so far ahead of his classmates in elementary school that when he was only fourteen years old the Brothers engaged him as a substitute teacher. Despite the objection of his parents, who wanted to keep him at home, and the reluctance of the superiors, who thought he was too short of stature, he was finally admitted to the novitiate. From 1821 to 1841 he taught successfully in the network of elementary schools conducted by the Brothers out of the administrative center at Clermont-Ferrand. In 1841 he was appointed Director of a school that was opening in Saugues, an isolated village on a barren plateau in southern France. For the next twenty years he worked quietly and effectively as teacher and principal to educate the boys in the village and some from the neighboring farms, many of whom were in their teens and had never been to school before. Small as he was, he was known as a strict but fair disciplinarian. In time the little school became the center of the social and intellectual life of the village, with evening classes for the adults and tutoring for the less gifted students. Brother Benilde's extraordinary religious sense was evident to everyone: at Mass with the students in the parish church, teaching catechism, preparing boys for first communion, visiting and praying with the sick, and rumors of near-miraculous cures. He was especially effective in attracting religious vocations. At his death more than 200 Brothers and an impressive number of priests had been his students at Saugues. At his beatification, Pope Pius XII stressed that his sanctification was attained by enduring "the terrible daily grind" and by "doing common things in an uncommon way."







Seniors, while enjoying juicy hamburgers, cold drinks, and delicious desserts, reminisced with their fellow Wolves about what made Saint Paul's great over the past four years: Friday night football games, Challenge Nights, the soccer State Finals appearances, various dances, pep rallies, and the Justin Addison Memorial Bike Ride. These moments easily became great memories for our seniors, but will not be easily forgotten.

Senior Brett Labasse said, "It just feels incredible to finally have this little piece of metal on my finger. It symbolizes so much for the senior class as a whole. I wish I could stay with these guys for the rest of my life; they are a family to me."





Luke was selected as a member of Team Liberty. The final game of the series was televised on ESPNU; Team Pride defeated Team Liberty 11-10. Quint Kessenich selected a Top 10 list comprised from both teams. His review of Luke's ability included, "Posner runs like a gazelle and scored a goal in the title game. He is extremely light on his feet and played through a calf bruise after being pegged by a shot in the early rounds. The high school football player with adequate size has been playing for just four years, and if I were a DI program I'd be doing further research." Kessenich also declared Saint Paul's to be among the top Louisiana Lacrosse teams.
