

I look forward to seeing you soon.



Saint Paul's School began raising money for its annual Adopt-a-Family program during the week of November 30<sup>th</sup>. This program gives students a chance to live out the Lasallian Core Principle of Concern for the Poor and Social Justice by donating money to the program or volunteering to shop for, wrap, or deliver gifts.

Students and faculty members almost always describe the experience of delivering the gifts as a very moving experience.

"One year I was able to have the privilege of bringing the presents to one of the families that our school adopted," said senior Luke Avenel, "I will never forget the joy that those kids had when they received their gifts even though they were living in a rough situation. I will never forget the happiness I was able to bring those kids simply by giving them new clothes and a few new toys."

Fundraising will continue through December 12. Then, students from each grade level and their moderators will go shopping for Christmas gifts for the families they have "adopted", most of which will be essentials such as clothes, toiletries, and toys for the children.

This year, each grade level, 8-12, plans to adopt two families, instead of the usual one, and the wrestling team will be adopting an additional family.

The students will also have a chance to show their concern for the poor and social justice by donating their gently used winter outerwear to the Warm Hearts coat drive, which is organized annually by the Lasallian Youth Leaders and National Honor Society. Warm Hearts, started by Saint Paul's pre-freshmen Sean Noel, donates coats, sweaters, hats, gloves, and other winter necessities to those in need in our community.

# Allstate Sugar Bowl/LHSAA State Swim Meet



Saint Paul's Aqua Wolves earned the highest state ranking since becoming a 5A school in the 2015 high school state competition. Under the direction of Kris Babylon, a Saint Paul's graduate of '95 and former SPS swimmer, the Wolves swam well on both Friday at the preliminary events and on Saturday at the finals in Sulphur, Louisiana the weekend before the Thanksgiving break.

The 200 medley team of Harrison Prieto, Kyle Hladky, Griffin Guzan and Jack Cheng earned All State Honors at the Division 1 Championship level. Griffin

Guzan continued his top performance levels in the 50 fly setting a team record at 23:57 and then topped that time in the finals to win gold in the 100 fly with a time of 50.31.

Entering the 400 relay freestyle the Wolves were leading Hahnville by ten points for third place. The relay team, inspired by the chance to bring a new record in Division 1 competition swam an impressive race. Griffin Guzan, Myers Morgan, Harrison Prieto, and Jack Cheng dropped over three seconds from the preliminary time to finish second with a 3:16:00 time, securing the third place spot in the championship meet with 196 team points.

The Wolves earned a number of honors at the meet including: Four All State Swims: Griffin Guzan, state champion in the 100 butterfly, and second in the 200 medley relay and Harrison Prieto, third in the 100 backstroke, and second in the 400 freestyle relay.

The team set seven varsity school records including: 200 medley relay 1:37.23, Jack Cheng 50 free 21.81, Griffin Guzan 50 fly 23:53, 100 fly 50.31, 200 free relay 1;32.03, 100 freestyle 47.93, and the 400 freestyle relay 3:16.00.

Drew Putfark, a current prefreshman, set a school record for his division in the 100 breaststroke with a time of 1:07:77.


