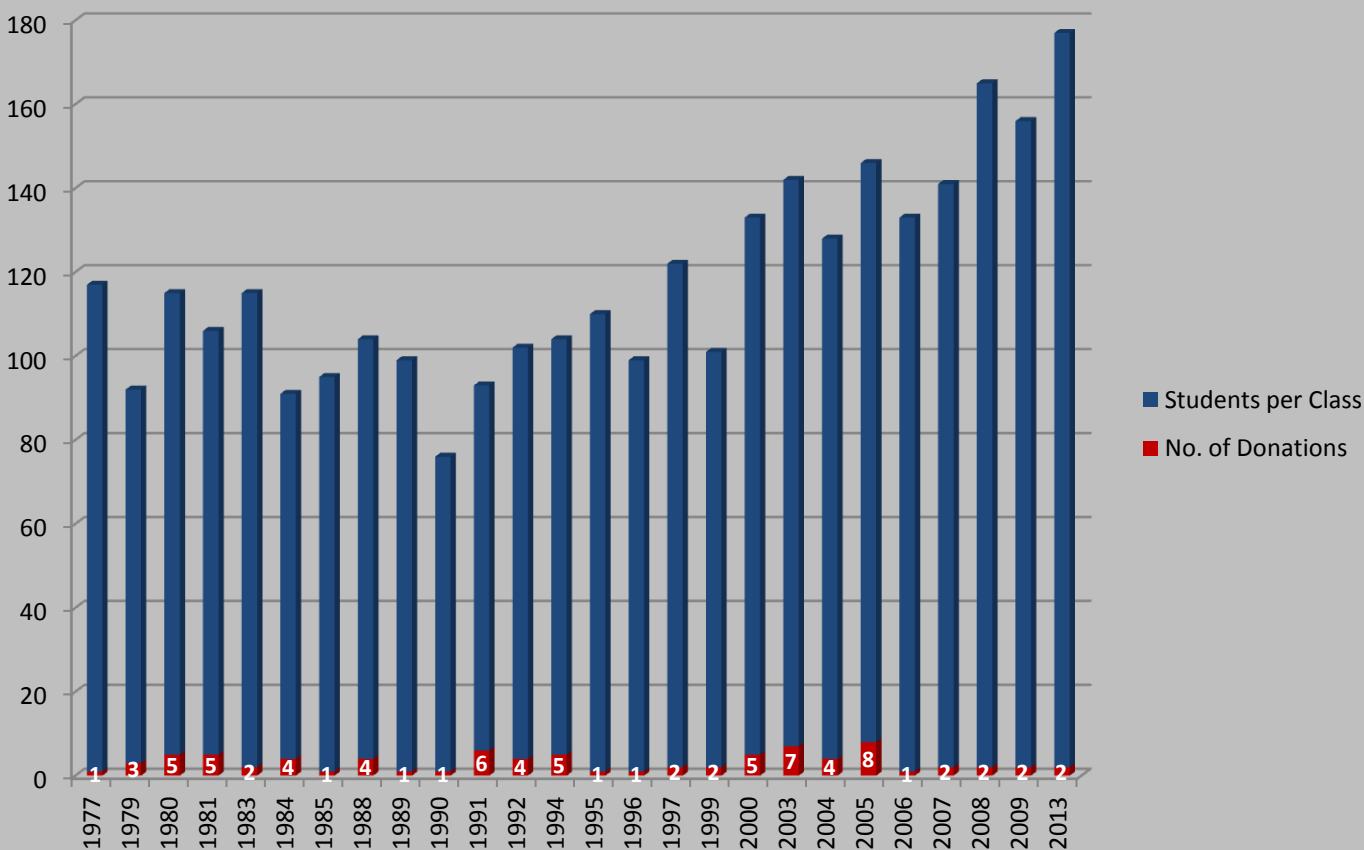
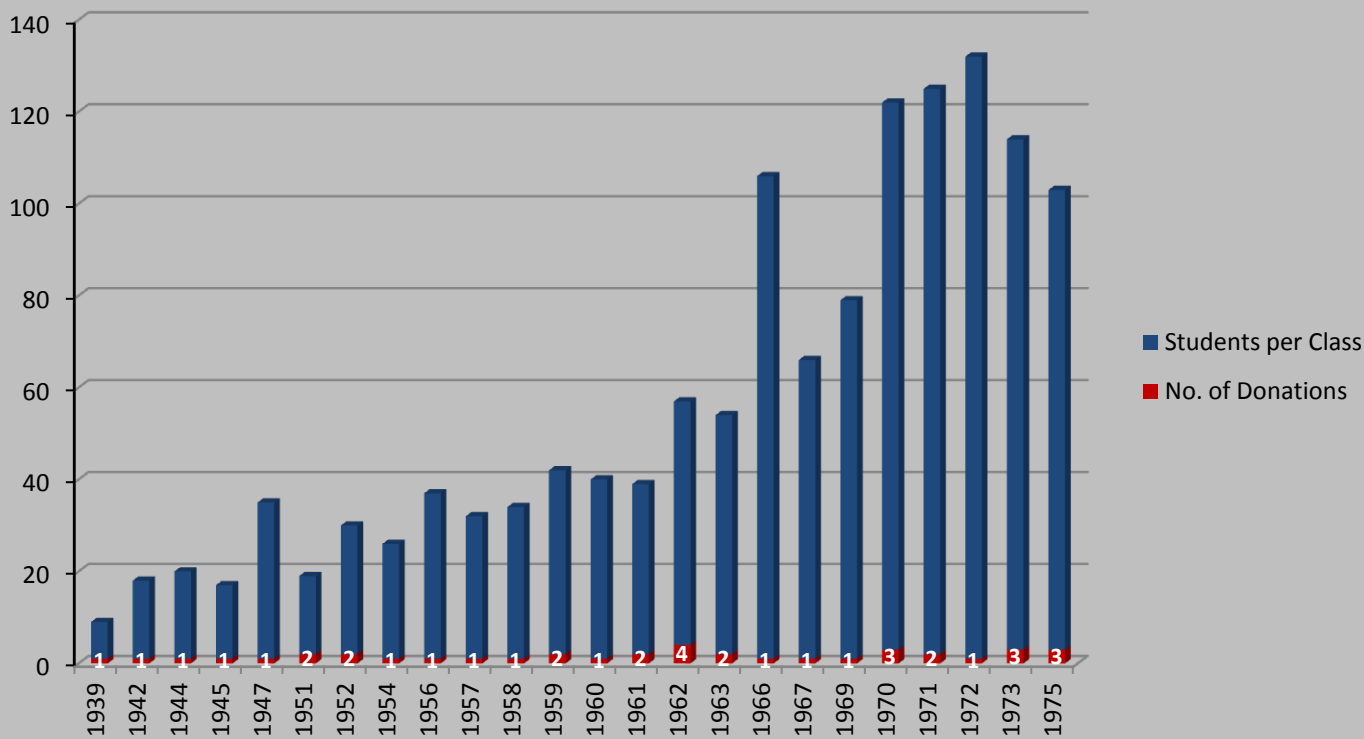

# Alumni Annual Giving by Class

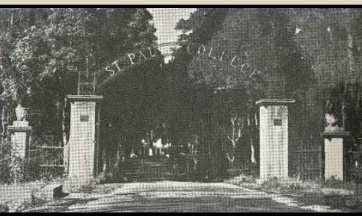

A grand oak tree stands majestically at the head of Lasalle Drive between Our Lady of Peace Chapel and Founder's Circle. The tree is present today, and can be seen in the earliest photos of Saint Paul's. What wonderful stories he could tell, if only he could talk. Under the shade of our magnificent tree is a small monument dedicated to Brother Cassian Lange, FSC; also known as Dashin' Cassian, a nickname given to him early in his teaching career at Saint Paul's. He was truly a man who gave many years of service to the Christian Brothers and to Saint Paul's.



The simple brick pillar bears a quotation from the Meditations of Saint John Baptist De La Salle #208.2. The inscription reads: *Oh, what joy a Brother of the Christian Schools will have when he sees a great number of his students in possession of eternal happiness, for which they are indebted to him by the grace of Jesus Christ! What a sharing of joy there will be between the teacher and his disciples! What a special union with one another there will be in the presence of God! It will be for them a great satisfaction, sharing together the blessing for which the call of God had given the hope, the wealth of glorious heritage of God in the dwelling of the saints.*



1917-2007

Brother Cassian, a very capable man, served our school in many ways: Sub Director (Assistant Principal) in 1947, Director (Principal) from 1948-1951, and again from 1955-1961. He also served directorships at several other schools in the New Orleans-Santa Fe Province. In addition he worked as Head of Vocations for a number of years. Brother Cassian entered the Christian Brothers in 1933 and made his final vows in 1942. He taught in the classroom and also served as a prefect in the dorms in his early years at Saint Paul's. As principal he started the first Saint Paul's fundraising enterprise to build the main classroom building and garnered enough funding to also construct the infirmary to house the sick students and give Saint Paul's borders the advantage of having a registered nurse not only on the staff, but also residing on the campus. He moved to De La Salle in New Orleans in 1991, and was semi-retired. In 1994 he came back to Saint

Paul's and retired here. "Retired" was not a good description for Brother Cassian. Every day he took a long walk around and through the campus, greeting students, faculty and visitors alike. Today let us offer a word of thanks to Brother Cassian, FSC for all he did for the Saint Paul's Community and remember he prays for us daily.

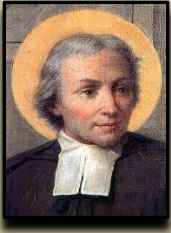

# School News



Many people in Saint Tammany Parish would be surprised to know that Saint Paul's School is not run by the Archdioceses of New Orleans. While the school follows its rules, procedures, and guidelines, Saint Paul's is officially run by Christian Brothers. In fact, about fifteen Christian Brothers live on campus and are housed in the Brothers Residence beside Brother Alfred Pond. Two years ago, the Brothers Residence was fully renovated to become the official home for retired brothers in the District of New Orleans-Santa Fe which contains Louisiana, Texas, New Mexico, and Colorado. Only fifty-five total brothers live in this province with six other brothers living on the south shore. However, starting July 1, 2014, the District New Orleans-Santa Fe will join with the District of San Francisco to make the District of San Francisco-New Orleans. This new district brings in the addition of California, Arizona, Washington, and Oregon.

In preparation for this July 1 launch, Saint Paul's has been busy. Earlier this school year in September, a team of Lasallian educators, consisting of principals and administrators from Christian Brothers middle school and De La Salle High School on the southshore and San Miguel High School in Arizona, spent several days on campus dissecting every aspect of Saint Paul's. They interviewed students and teachers, sat in on classes, toured buildings, polled the entire student body, and simply learned what it meant to be a Saint Paul's wolf. After extensive analysis, the Lasallian team gathered with the faculty and staff to share what it discovered about our 103 year old school.

To no one's surprise, Saint Paul's scored top marks in every category of the team's evaluation. The scores were so high, in fact, that the team offered to give the student body a holiday the following Monday. However, anyone familiar with the type of students that attend Saint Paul's would know that this dedicated student body would never want to miss out on a day filled with extraordinary teaching and learning. The 880 academic wolves graciously declined the team's offer.

The Lasallian team made another trip to our 40 acre campus on Wednesday, January 22, to check up on things. Many Saint Paul's veterans were on this team including Charles Legendre, long time football and track coach and religion teacher at Saint Paul's; Brother Peter Tripp, long time counselor and college advisor; and Brother Tim Coldwell, state champion soccer coach and English teacher. This group met with the executive board of the Lasallian Youth Leaders during their lunch period to learn how the student body continues to spread the mission of Saint John Baptist De La Salle. The Executive board consisted of seniors Eric Boudet, Michael Burke, and Thomas Ruli; juniors Ross Allbritton, Burke Irwin, Faiz Salam, and William Saucier; and sophomores Austin Grashoff and Adam Schmitt.

# Science Fair



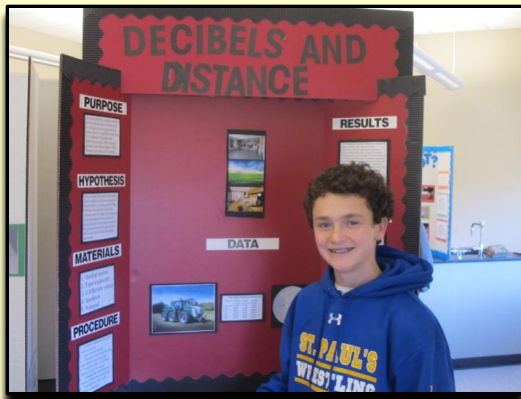
