

School News





Mu Alpha Theta, the national mathematics honor society, has long been one of the most exclusive, specialized, and successful clubs on campus. Coming away with multiple wins at various math tournaments around the state, the club has boasted a strong winning streak. These victories are all achieved by a dedicated mix of students who faithfully pile onto multiple buses early on Saturday mornings to compete with the best analytical minds from around the state.

Each student that joins the society has to have completed five semesters of high school math as a minimum and have an overall grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale and have only A's and B's for semester grades in math courses. All members of $MA\Theta$ must be invited to join by the club's moderators, Mrs. Susan Jordan and Mrs. Pamela Cullen.

While all Saint Paul's students can attend any math tournament they like, all members of the society are required to take part in at least one tournament as well as tutor three to five hours per semester. However, students who wish to attend the state competition in Baton Rouge must attend a total of two tournaments other than any events hosted at Saint Paul's.

Recently, the Saint Paul's Math Wolves have come away with a decisive victory at the Catholic High School Tournament hosted on the 21st of January. Saint Paul's won two major awards, the first being first place in sweepstakes and the second being second overall. Sweepstakes is the tallying of all points earned by individual winners coupled with a unique algorithm that levels the playing field by taking into account both the number of people on each team and the type and status of each school and its programs.

Such a large, elaborate club requires the leadership of a dedicated executive board. Members include Alex Oliveri as President, Alex Seese as Vice President, Shane Strander as Treasurer, and Ruston Keller as District 3 Governor.

Hornbeck Offshore Business and Law



Saint Paul's School has had a long history offering specialized extracurricular activities and classes geared towards real world passions and careers. This bold tradition is continued at Saint Paul's with two special extracurricular offerings, mock trial and the young lawyers program, and a uniquely taught Introduction to Law Studies class all designed to satisfy student passions for the worlds of law and litigation. The "law studies" class is part of the Hornbeck Offshore Business and Law Curriculum instituted at Saint Paul's several years ago.

The first of the two activities, Teen Court, is a program that is almost entirely exclusive to Saint Paul's over other area schools. The special program aims to place student lawyers directly into the criminal justice system. The program tasks a small number of Saint Paul's students to be legitimate defense attorneys for fellow peers whose crimes have been knocked down from criminal court. The system is run out of Baton Rouge with the select team making the commute almost every Monday after school. The entire process is especially crucial because the students are dealing with the lives of real people and their families rather than the fictional musings of a mock trial committee or the material for a practice debate in a law class. While both extremely taxing and difficult, the process often yields decreased, minimized, or completely erased sentences based entirely on the students' arguments in front of real jurors, judges, and other law professionals. The program is carefully monitored and cared for by Business and Law moderator Brian Logarbo.

The second student organization provides an interesting look at exposing students to a simulated courtroom environment. Mock Trial has long been a staple for those passionate about law at Saint Paul's. Students divide into teams of six with three lawyers and three witnesses. All teams must prepare to be both defense as well as prosecution on the same case with witnesses memorizing two vastly different parts and lawyers preparing different sets of questions, opening statements, and cross-examinations. The cases change each year and are sent out by the Louisiana Bar Association who host the competition. This year, Saint Paul's did exceedingly well with three teams competing and one of the students, Bradley del Rio, being recognized as the best witness present at the competition. Moderators for the club include law teacher and attorney Greg Pellegrini as well as special volunteer attorney Chuck Hughes Jr., father of senior Trey Hughes. Finally, these after school opportunities are bookended by an intro to law studies class taught by Greg Pellegrini. Mr. Pellegrini is both an alumnus of Saint Paul's as well as a current Saint Paul's parent to his son Jack Pellegrini, a sophomore student. Mr. Pellegrini's unique experience in the field of law gives him the ability to educate students on things far beyond the basic laws and practices of court. The class covers everything from courtroom decorum to effective writing and speaking to an extensive overview of the laws of the country and the state.

These specialized opportunities remain at the forefront of the Saint Paul's mission to present a deeply personalized and relevant education that each and every student can find their passion in. The Lasallian Core Principal of Quality Education is definitely being met by this program.
