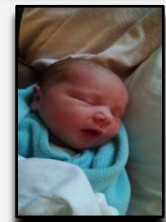

The Saint Paul's online student newspaper, thepaperwolf.com has recently received numerous awards from the Columbia University Scholastic Press Association and the Louisiana Scholastic Press Association. For the third year consecutive year, *The Paper Wolf* received the Gold Medal from the Columbia University Scholastic Press Association. The site was judged on its content from December 2014 to November 2015 and earned 950 out of a possible 1,000 points, placing it in the 95th percentile of high school digital newspapers online.

The Paper Wolf also earned the gold achievement award in the news site essentials category and All-Columbian Honors in the verbal content and visual content categories from the Columbia university Scholastic Press Association.

The Louisiana Scholastic Press Association awarded Saint Paul's forty-three total awards, including the first place overall award for having the best student media program in the state. Media programs were judged based on content produced between November 2014 and October 2015.

The Paper Wolf won first place awards from the Louisiana Scholastic Press Association for having the best digital/online newspaper and the best social media presence. *The Paper Wolf* also competed in the best overall newspaper category, which included categories that *The Paper Wolf* automatically scored a zero in because it is a digital newspaper. Nevertheless, *The Paper Wolf* took third in the category.

The Wolves also won many individual awards. Junior Nick Ashton won nine awards for his work on *The Paper Wolf* and three during on-site competitions at the Louisiana Scholastic Press Association Competition. Junior Jordan Kliebert won three awards for his work on *The Paper Wolf* and one during on-site competitions; senior Adam Satterlee won three awards for his work on *The Paper Wolf*; senior Parker Layman, junior AJ Lacroix, and sophomore Luc Hebert each won an award for their work on *The Paper Wolf* and an award in an on-site competition; graduate Casey Fitzmaurice ('15), juniors Kyle Hladkey and Nico Arcuri, and sophomore Carson Caulfield each won two awards for their work on *The Paper Wolf*; and junior Tyler Petro won one award for his work on *The Paper Wolf*.

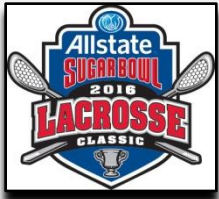
