Saint Paul's Senior, Harrison Prieto, a third generation legacy, has been selected as WWL High School Athlete of the Week. Freshman Chris Wilson was selected (for the third time!) to compete in the 2015 Allstate Sugar Bowl Tommy Moore Memorial Junior Golf Championship held on December 28-29, 2015. The 36-hole championship was established to invite top-ranked golfers from across the country to compete in front of college coaches each holiday season in New Orleans. The field comprised of eighty-four amateur golfers, both boys and girls ages 13-18, who are not enrolled in college representing eleven states.

Tommy Moore is recognized as the most accomplished junior golfer to ever emerge from the New Orleans area. In 1980, Tommy was ranked No. 1 in the Golf Digest Junior World Rankings and went on to have a decorated collegiate career at Oklahoma State University where he was an All-American, National Champion, and Academic All-American. After playing on the PGA TOUR for three seasons, Tommy Moore's life was cut short at the young age of 35 due to a rare blood disease. In his memory, the Kelly Gibson Foundation partners with the Allstate Sugar Bowl to host a national tournament that recognizes the impact Tommy made on junior golf.

AquaWolves

For the first time in school history, the Saint Paul's AquaWolves placed five swimmers and their coach on the New Orleans Advocate's 2015 All Metro Swim Team. Griffin Guzan was selected based on his state championship performance in the 100 butterfly, setting the school record in 50.41. Guzan joined relay mates, Harrison Prieto, Kyle Hladky and Jack Cheng to lead the area in the 200 medley relay in another school record of 1:37.23. Myers Morgan, Prieto, Guzan and Cheng were the All Metro 400 freestyle relay team, again setting the school record of 3:16.00. St. Paul's Coach Kris Babylon was selected All Metro Coach of the Year by the New Orleans Advocate.
