School News



David Englehardt

Saint Paul's School is pleased to announce that The National High School Coaches Association, NHSCA, has selected David Englehardt as a 2013 NHSCA High School Academic All American. This year marks the 20th year in which the NHSCA has honored those who triumph both in and out of the classroom. 140 Academic All-Americans were selected from thirty-two states; seventy-two of that number were seniors. This year's honorees excel in eight sports and are the epitome of what a student-athlete is, succeeding in both their sport and the classroom. These young men will be recognized in the National High School Sports Hall of Fame Museum.

David, a member of the Saint Paul's Wrestling Team, has maintained a 4.5 GPA. He was selected as a valedictorian for the class of 2013. David was a state champion in his junior year, and finished second in the state in 2013.

He has a career record of 118-45. His senior year record was 37-4; he placed in

six tournaments, and won three tournament championships. He was also an active member of Mu Alpha Theta, the national math honor society. Craig Ketelsen states, "He has natural ability both as wrestler and as an athlete. The combination of his natural talent and his incredible work ethic led to his success. He was a strong leader for our team by example."

Saint Paul's graduate of 2013, Connor Campo, son of Paul and Shellie Campo of Bush, Louisiana has been selected as the National Wrestling Coaches Association Scholastic Division 2012-13 Louisiana Outstanding Wrestler. Connor, holds a number of tournament, parish and regional championships, and has earned two consecutive state titles in his junior and senior years. He is undefeated in state competition for the last two years, earning 106 wins. His senior year record was 46-0. In addition to being selected as Wrestler of the Year, he was also chosen as New Orleans Sugar Bowl Foundation Amateur Athlete for the month of February, and the Saint Paul's Outstanding Wrestler for 2013. He will attend Wartburg College on a wrestling scholarship. Athletic Director, Craig Ketelsen, states, "Connor is incredibly talented, but he works harder than anyone on the team. He trained harder than anyone in the state."
