Christian Bergeron '12 – Christian has been accepted into the LSU School of Medicine in Shreveport.

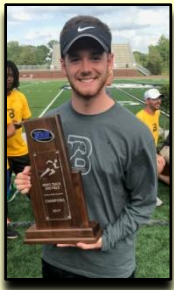
Vincent Orlando '12 – Vincent graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering from LSU.

Christopher Ikner '13 – Christopher graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Accounting from LSU.

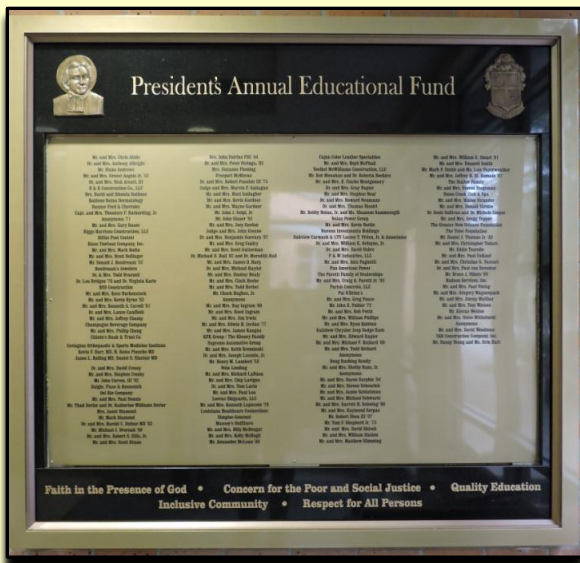
Larry Perrin '13 – Larry graduated with BBA in Business Administration from Texas Christian University.

The room was decorated with blue and white table clothes and red, white and blue centerpieces. In addition, the Prisoners of War/Missing in Action table was set in front of the stage. This table is set for one to symbolize that they are missing from our midst. The table cloth is white to represent the purity of their intentions to respond to our country's call to arms. The single rose reminds us of the families and loved ones who keep faith awaiting their return. The red ribbon tied to the vase is reminiscent of the red ribbon worn on the lapel of thousands to demand a proper accounting for our missing. A slice of lemon on the bread plate reminds us of their bitter fate and the salt is symbolic of the family's tears as they wait. The glass is inverted to represent that they cannot toast with us at dinner and the chair is empty because they are not here.

Numerous national organizations were present to award cadets who met the specific criteria for the unique awards. Cadet James Alex Seese '17 was the Master of Ceremony, and the guest speaker was Sergeant Christian Guilbeau '12, Embarkation Non-Commissioned Officer for Marine Forces Reserve and Marine Forces North. 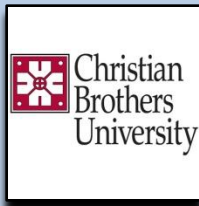
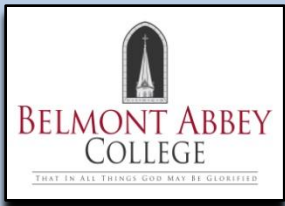

Lacrosse – STATE CHAMPIONS!

The Saint Paul's Wolves captured their first State Championship with a 10-9 win over the five time defending champion Jesuit Bluejays in the LHSLL Championship Game in Lafayette, LA on April 30th.

The Wolves defeated the St. Thomas More Cougars 9-6 in the semifinals to set up the championship showdown with Jesuit. It was the Wolves' sixth consecutive LHSLL Final Four appearance. In previous appearances, the Wolves have fallen to Jesuit.

Sophomore attackman Christopher Flood was named the Championship Game Offensive MVP. Flood had two goals and an assist in the game. Senior goalkeeper Liam Ordoyne was named the game's Defensive MVP. Ordoyne finished with 10 saves including a game saving stop in the final seconds. The Wolves were led on offense by senior attackman Dylan Futrell with two goals and two assists. Ryan Flood added two fourth quarter goals. Senior midfielder Eli Crosby added three goals while senior midfielder Al Satches added one goal.

The Wolves finished the season with a 17-1 record, going undefeated in the state of Louisiana.
