Athletic Awards



LSU Spring Testing



Saint Paul's School has received the Golden Achievement Award from Louisiana State University for outstanding accomplishments in the spring testing program for the sixth consecutive year. Thirty-six members of the Class of 2014 earned 504 hours in college credit. The tuition dollar value of this achievement is \$283,250.00. The students accumulated 138 hours in English, 185 hours in Spanish, and 181 hours in Math and Science. 
Senior Night
