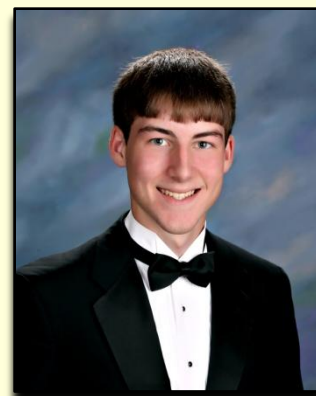
George James Cazenavette

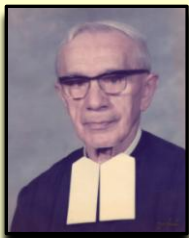

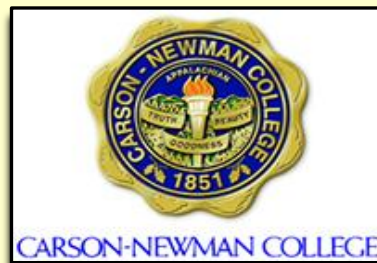

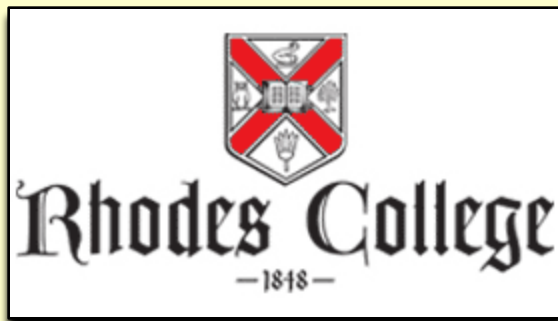
