107th Graduating Class of Saint Paul's School

Saint Paul's School honored the class of 2018, the 107th graduating class, with the traditional commencement ceremony on Saturday, May 12th, 2018 at 4:00 pm. in the Briggs Assembly Center on Saint Paul's Campus. One hundred sixty-two students received diplomas from Brother Raymond Bulliard, FSC, President of Saint Paul's School, at the graduation mass celebrated by Reverend Matthew Clark, OSB, Chaplain of Saint Paul's.

Mr. Trevor Watkins, Principal, served as Master of Ceremonies, while Assistant Principal, Mr. Joe Dickens, and Senior Counselor, Mrs. Renee Miller, assisted with awards and diploma presentations. Brother Ken Boesch, FSC served as the musician for the graduation ceremony. The Mothers' Club of Saint Paul's sponsored an outdoor reception on campus under the Wolfdome following the ceremony for the Class of 2018 and their guests.

The class boasts a number of major academic and athletic accomplishments. They have been accepted to over 100 colleges and universities and have earned over sixteen million dollars in scholarships. Two students were recognized by the National Merit Scholarship Program: Matthew Borgatti was awarded a scholarship from the National Merit Corporation as a National Merit Finalist, and Michael Dodick was named a Commended Scholar. Thirty-eight seniors were named to All State Academic Sports Teams by the state of Louisiana.

Eighteen members of the 2018 class were recognized by Louisiana State University and granted college credit hours for spring testing. Those seniors accumulated over 144 hours of credit in English, Math, and Spanish, earning over \$105,264.00 in tuition credit.

Robert Ferrante received an appointment to the Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland. He was honored with nominations from Congressman Steve Scalise as well as both Louisiana Senators, John Kennedy and Bill Cassidy. Robby has chosen Aerospace Engineering as his major.

Thirteen seniors will attend colleges and universities on scholarships that will allow them to continue their athletic careers in baseball, basketball, football, soccer, swimming, tennis, track and wrestling. 

Jared Thieler will wrestle for the University of Northern Colorado; Myers Morgan will swim on the Queens College Team in North Carolina. Caleb Lupo will play baseball for Delgado. Kent Shiell will play tennis at Belmont Abbey,

The coaching staff earned eight district coaches of the year, and one parish coach of the year. Sean Moser was selected Soccer Coach of the Year for the region, and Craig Ketelsen was selected State Coach of the Year for Wrestling.
