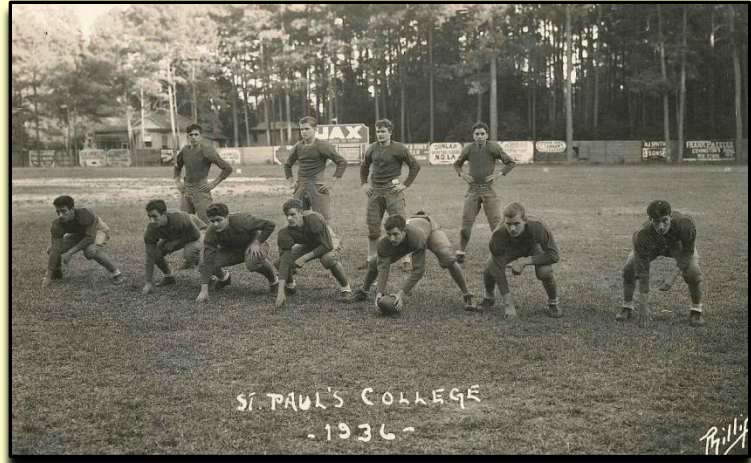

As many of you are aware, Saint Paul's School President Brother Ray Bulliard is quite fond of music appreciation as well as tradition particularly regarding his President's Assemblies. Over a decade ago, then Senior Kramer Johnson '04, performed a slightly customized version of the song, "I Feel Home" by O.A.R. to the entire student body with a clear message echoed in the title and lyrics of the song-- Saint Paul's was home to him. Each and every year since Kramer has graduated, Brother Ray has eloquently and fittingly used the song as his selected musical piece for the post Homecoming Assembly.

On Wednesday, September 30th, 2015, while taking into account Brother Ray's aforementioned predictability, we were able to add an element of surprise. On a morning which was likely the last President's Assembly in the old gymnasium, Kramer graced the current students and faculty of Saint Paul's with an encore performance to the one which he did in during his Senior Year.

While covertly stashed away in the training room with the door slightly cracked, Kramer listened intently, "I Feel Home" playing in the background. He was able to candidly soak in the words that Brother Ray had been conveying about him to our alumni for all of these years...." and he sat right here, and he played this song....and he sang from the heart because to him Saint Paul's was another home....It was such a powerful moment that I said ever year at Homecoming I would tell the story of Kramer singing for us...." On that cue, Kramer emerged into the back of the gymnasium, soon after being noticed by the omniscient Brother Ray who was found in a rare state of being "lost for words."

We are most grateful to Kramer who coordinated his schedule to join us, in spite a few moves of Assembly dates. Kramer flew in for the occasion from Atlanta, returned HOME, inspired our students and alumni to do the same, and made one more great memory in the G-Plex.

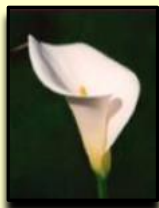

Saint Paul's School Founder's Week



During the week of October 12-16 Saint Paul's School Celebrated Founder's Week, which commemorates the life of Saint John Baptist de La Salle, the patron saint of educators and the Founder of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, the order which run Saint Paul's.

The Lasallian Youth Leaders, led by President Patrick Stewart and moderator Jeaneen Schmitt, organized various activities and assemblies each day to go along with that day's theme, which was one of the five Lasallian Core Principles.

On Monday, athletic director Craig Ketelsen gave a moving reflection on the Core Principle of "Respect for All Persons" at a school-wide assembly, reminding the students that respecting all is a challenge, saying, "It is the difficult path. It will take strength."

On Tuesday, keeping with the Core Principle of "Quality Education", the oldest living alumnus of Saint Paul's, Frank Lombardo '37 spoke to the students about the value of his Saint Paul's education and urged the students to take advantage of the opportunity to study at Saint Paul's.

Additionally, teachers discussed the importance of their educations with students during classes on Tuesday, and students wrote thank-you letters to teachers during their English classes.

On Friday, students of each grade level competed with one another against the other grade levels during field day in an attempt to foster a more “Inclusive Community,” the final Core Principle. Students competed in capture the flag, ultimate frisbee, soccer, and basketball. The annual faculty-senior volleyball game was also held, with the faculty capturing a decisive victory. 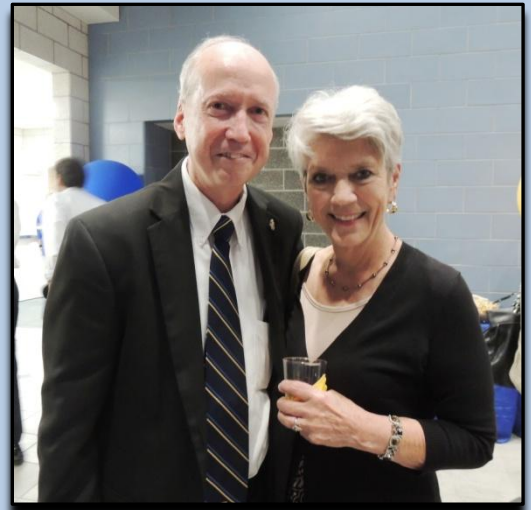
