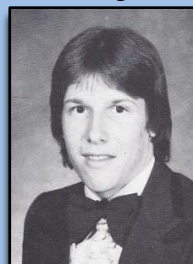

The Academic All-America program honors the nation's top male and female student-athletes annually who have succeeded at the highest level on the playing field and in the classroom. After his junior year, Brandon carries a 3.66 GPA in the Freeman School of Business Management at Tulane University in New Orleans. He hit eight homers and drove in 36 runs, stealing 10 bases. He did not make an error. He recorded 96 putouts and one assist. He was selected as a Conference USA first-team player.

Houston Bates '10 – Houston continues his football career at the University of Illinois. He has maintained a 3.7 grade point average with a major in pre-medicine. He intends to return to Louisiana to attend Tulane Medical School, if not drafted by the National Football League.

Carter Guice III '10 – Carter is a junior majoring in biology at [Hampden-Sydney College](#), and has received early selection to the School of Medicine and Health Sciences at [The George Washington University \(GW\)](#) through an innovative joint program. An Allan Scholar, Carter is a member of the Pre-Health Society and the scientific honor society Chi Beta Phi. The innovative joint program allows talented pre-medical students at Hampden-Sydney to apply to the Early Selection Program during the second semester of their sophomore year as an undergraduate. Once selected, students are given a provisional admittance to the M.D. program at GW upon the completion of their undergraduate degree and requirements of the program.

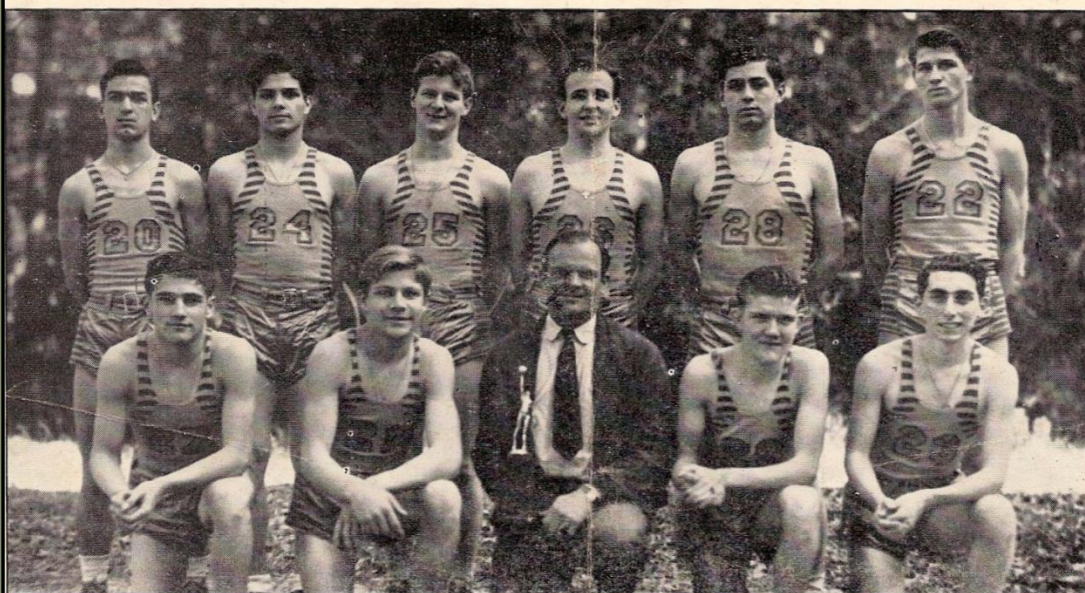

Saint Paul's Facilities Update



We recently discovered some structural issues with the west wall of the student center that demand immediate attention. Some of you may remember that the student center was originally built in the late 1950's as an open but covered recreation area. In the 1960's, the space was enclosed which allowed the school to use it as an assembly room for all sorts of school activities – ranging from school dances, talent shows, and even junior high basketball practice. In 1995, the building underwent a major renovation to expand and modernize the facility.

Since then, the building has seen almost constant use.

Seventeen years of almost constant use, however, have taken their toll on the student center, and so the Saint Paul's Board of Trustees has decided to use this opportunity of needed repairs to completely renovate the building. The good news is that we will have a freshly renovated, larger student center. The bad news is that we will not have use of the center from August through January. Accordingly, we have to re-schedule many events and move them to other venues.

This unexpected renovation, coming so soon after the renovation of La Salle Hall, is challenging us financially, but with your help through the Annual Fund, Jazz 'N Roll, and, we hope, through a couple of major gifts (Hint! Hint! – and no gift is too small), we know we can accomplish it. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we deal with this major construction issue. Stay tuned! 8th Grade Promotion Ceremony

Saint Paul's School administration, faculty, and families of eighth graders gathered in the Student Center to congratulate the 178 students who completed their first year of required course work. Brother Raymond Bulliard, FSC, Principal/President of Saint Paul's served as Master of Ceremonies for the evening with Brother Ken Boesch, FSC providing music for the ceremony. Trevor Watkins, Assistant Principal, announced the names of the academic award winners and candidates for promotion.

The program began with the traditional Saint Paul's opening hymn, Rise Up, Oh, Men of God. The Reading from The Book of Samuel, done by John Cresson, Billy Harrison, Nicholas Oubre, and Cray Pennison discussed the Lord calling Samuel to service. The eighth grade class sang the responsorial psalm, Here I Am Lord. The second reading, A Letter to the Ephesians, continued the program with Class President, Rutger Fury, Vice-President, Austin Grashoff, and Order of Saint LaSalle Medal Winners, Nick Bourne, and Brett Manifold.
