





The Golfing Wolves, led by religion teacher Luke Barwick, journeyed to Shreveport to compete in their state championship at East Ridge Country Club. The golfing competition lasted over a two day period on April 29 and 30. After shooting a 290 as a team on the first day, the Wolves went into the final round down by two strokes to Barbe High School. However, the Wolves would not back down. Five of the Wolves shot in the 70s to win their first ever Division I State Championship and their first state title since back-to-back wins in 98-99.
