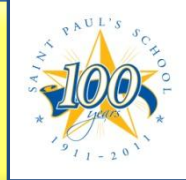

Golden Jubilarians' Weekend/Senior Induction May 2nd-May 3rd

Fifty years ago thirty-four seniors graduated from Saint Paul's College to become the class of 1961. On Sunday, May 1, 2011, members of the 50th year class, celebrated their reunion with a crawfish boil on campus. On Monday, May 2nd, they gathered once again in the gym, now named for Gene Bennett, to be honored by the present administration, faculty, and student body of Saint Paul's School.

Brother Raymond Bulliard, welcomed and introduced the returning alumni, and gave the present student body a history lesson on 1961 including information about Saint Paul's as well as professional sports, the most popular TV sitcoms, the old "star theater", which has since been closed down but the building still remains on the corner of New Hampshire and Gibson in downtown Covington.

The ceremony then shifted into honoring the alumni with the alumni association director Mike Richard '68 awarding each of the returning sons of Saint Paul's with a jubilee diploma. After the jubilee diplomas were handed out, Bobby Pecuna spoke to the student body about what his time at Saint Paul's meant in shaping the rest of his life.

The next presentation was a special gift from the class of 1951 to Brother Ray and the official induction of the class of 2011 into the Saint Paul's alumni association. The senior class took an oath in front of the entire school. They promised to uphold the Lasallian Core Principles of Saint Paul's School even once they have left its halls and moved on, and most importantly promised to "Rise Up, Oh, Men of God."

The ceremony then came to a close as the class of 2011 received the prestigious alumni association pins from the class of 1961, and as always the assembly was closed out with the student body singing a proud rendition of the school fight song.

Finally, on Monday evening, during the annual Volunteer Appreciation Banquet, the 50 year alumni were given special seating and enjoyed words from Brother Ray with several live performances from the Marian Players' production of Guys and Dolls.

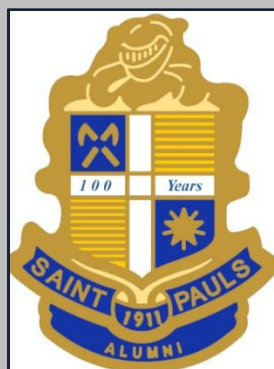

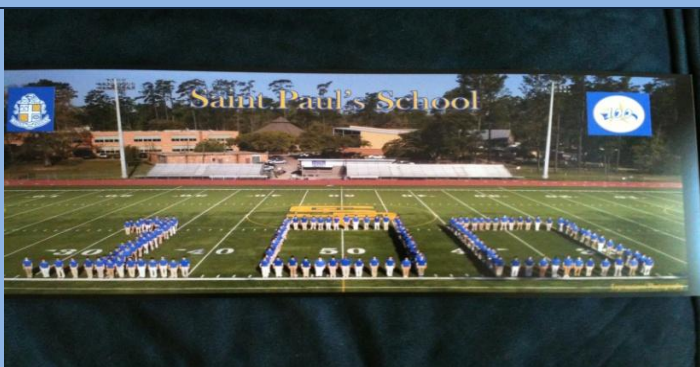

Shell-Eco Marathon

On Thursday, April 14th, Saint Paul's Wolves on Wheels team travelled to Houston for the Shell-Eco Marathon Competition. The team, moderated by science teachers John Carambat and Mark Richards, entered two fuel efficient vehicles into the competition. The Iron Clawzz car, #62, boasted a diesel engine and averaged 148 mpg. The Viper Wolf, #16, was a 48 pound, three wheel sled powered by a 30cc model airplane engine and averaged 498.6 mpg. The winning French Quebec Team from Laval University average 2,567 mpg! Mark Richards stated "Of the 21 years that I have been associated with Saint Paul's, this was by far the most challenging, frustrating, exhausting experience I have ever had, and the best. Several times, we almost threw in the towel. To watch these young men stick it out and accomplish what they did was worth the journey. The experience was overwhelming with the students constantly incurring setbacks, pitfalls, engine failures, drive train collapses, flat tires, electrical problems and even running out of gas. The students persevered through it all and walked away with a cash prize of \$1,000." LA-041 JROTC has been selected as one of the 401 units to receive the 2010-2011 Air Force Junior ROTC Distinguished Unit Award. 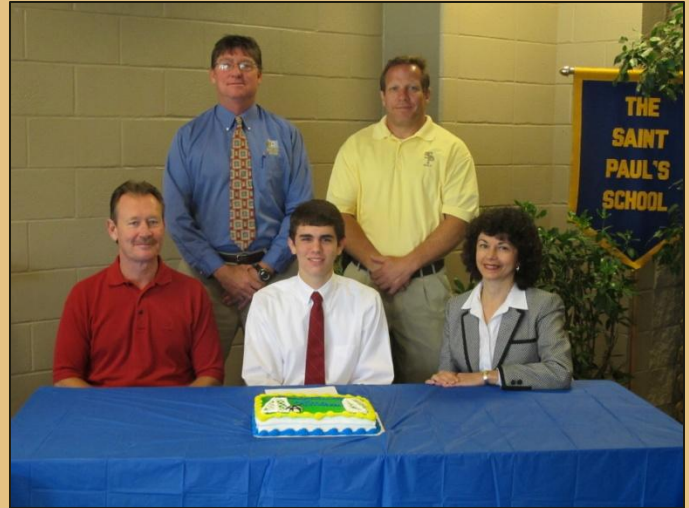
