Saint Paul's School honored the class of 2012, the 101st graduating class, with the traditional commencement ceremony on Sunday, May 20, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. in the Student Center. One hundred sixty-seven students received diplomas from Brother Raymond Bulliard, FSC, Principal of Saint Paul's School, at the graduation mass celebrated by Reverend Jude Israel with co-celebrant Father Jose' Lavastida, Rector of Notre Dame Seminary and uncle of salutatorian, Thomas Lavastida. Mr. Trevor Watkins, Assistant Principal, served as Master of Ceremonies, while Dean of Students, Mr. Ken Sears, and Senior Guidance Counselor, Mrs. Renee Miller, assisted with awards and diploma presentations. 





The program spent time remembering the highlights of the competitions of the sixteen sports played, by the over six hundred student athletes who compose the Saint Paul's teams on all grade levels. Athletic Director, Craig Ketelsen, opened the program and senior, Andrew Mullet led the prayer, and Pledge of Allegiance. Ketelsen went on to thank the administration, faculty, coaches, and parents for the success the school experienced "on the fields and floor." He continued with a quotation that expressed the sentiments of the Class of 2012, "We always played for the name on the front of the shirt, not for the name on the back." He continued his address with a quote from Muhammad Ali that gave tribute to all the athletes who participate at Saint Paul's, "Athletes become champions from something they have deep inside them: a desire, a dream, and a vision.

Ketelsen went on to comment on the success of the sports year for Saint Paul's. The dreams of student athletes were realized this year in the shape of eight district titles, a league championship, a metro title, a parish title, and a regional title. Fourteen out of the sixteen sports qualified for their state tournaments, eight teams placed in the top five in state in their sport including two state championship teams, Powerlifting and Gymnastics.

Individually, the quality of our student-athletes was evident in all phases of competition. This year we had fourteen Academic All-State performers including several composite (4.0) All-State team members, forty-nine All-District team members including three Most Valuable Players, seven All-Metro performers, eighteen All-State top five finishers, one state Most Valuable Player, six individual state champions, and one multiple year state champion. Saint Paul's earned eight Regional Championships. Three students were named All-Americans, Connor Campo, Cameron Robichaux, and Richard Stewart, and Brennan Skinner was a qualifier for the High School Nationals in gymnastics. Five school and two state records were broken, and the 3200m relay team composed of Zachary Albright, Christian Bergeron, Scott Brewster, and Nicholas Taylor ranked in the top ten of the nation. Wrestlers, Connor Campo and Chris Arms were recognized state champions who were undefeated in the state of Louisiana.

Seven seniors who will attend colleges and universities on scholarships that will allow them to continue their athletic careers were recognized including: Scott Brewster will run track for the University of Louisiana at Lafayette; Kristofer Brumfield will play football at Delta State University in Mississippi, Joel Buhler will play baseball at Loyola University in New Orleans, Jackson Fos will play basketball at Spring Hill College in Mobile, Seth Hagan and Andrew McGinnis will play soccer at Spring Hill, and Dylan Long will play football for McNeese State University in Lake Charles. In addition, Trent Domingue is a preferred walk on at Louisiana State University as a kicking specialist.

Outstanding student athletes were recognized for their achievements at the junior high and high school level. The Junior High Student Athlete Award was presented by Coaches Al Nastasi and Austin Speni and Dane Stubbs, 2009 winner of the award. Bradley Clawson and Connor Lu, both honor students, won awards. Two Junior High Dedication Awards were presented by Coach Sam Francis and, Mitchell Blaise winner of the award in 2009, Austin Groenveld and Adam Rush won these awards. The "Scott Dottolo Award" for the outstanding athlete on the junior high level was presented by Basketball Coach Phil Williams and Dylan Long, winner of the award in 2009, to Warner Moore and Francois Elzy.

The highest awards on the varsity level were also presented. Five Jason Whittle Memorial Awards were presented to students who demonstrate selflessness, positive attitude and respect for teammates. Craig Ketelsen presented awards to seniors, Adam Alonzo, James Cavaliere, Mike Jones, Sean Ross, and Sam Welty. The C. L. Marcotte Award for the best scholar athlete was presented by varsity football coach, Joe Dickens to four year football letterman and valedictorian, Gabe Emerson. The Eddie Polk Memorial Awards for dedication, sportsmanship and commitment to the Lasallian principles were presented by Josh Harrelson, to Dylan Long. The class of 2012 with its incredible athletic talents had two winners of The Jimmy Dunn Award for the best all around athlete. Craig Ketelsen, Athletic Director, bestowed awards to Chris Arms and Dane Stubbs.


