


KRAMER SCHMIDT

Two points separated Saint Paul's from Mandeville in the District Championship meet on Wednesday, November 4, at Fontainebleau State Park. Seniors Matt Mouton and Ethan Mizell led the Wolves team to their second title in two years. Mouton was overall champion in a time of 15:16 which is the fastest time run in the state this year. His time also moves him to number five on Saint Paul's all time top ten list. Mizell earned All District honors by running a very courageous race finishing third in a time of 15:58. His third place finish was probably the difference in the outcome of the meet. Also helping to secure the team title and finishing with big personal records and earning all district honors, were Scott Brewster 16:11, Ryan Durr 16:23, and Christian Bergeron 16:32. Rounding out the top seven were Collin O' Leary 16:45, a personal record, and Trey Weiss 17:38.

The Junior Varsity did an outstanding job, once again proving that we are a young team and have loads of talent. Taylor Rayer led them across the finish line with a personal record of 17:08, followed by eleven other Wolves with personal records, making this a great race. The Junior Varsity finished second behind Fontainebleau. Saint Paul's Cross Country Alumnus and Tulane Track Team member Brian Lozes showed up to support the team.

NORTHLAKE REGIONAL CHAMPS



On Thursday, October 29, the Saint Paul's Swim Team experienced the exhilaration of a once in a lifetime upset. The Aqua Wolves tenaciously battled not one, but two heavily favored teams in the Northlake Regional Championships at Franco's Athletic Club. Both Northshore High and Fontainebleau High boys teams decisively defeated the Wolves in the Central District Championships just five days prior, on Saturday. The Wolves swam their best meet of the season that day, but finished 97 points behind Northshore and eight points away from Fontainebleau. The Northshore Panthers had won the Regionals the last three years and had finished among the top three teams in the state three years running. They were prohibitive favorites to win with the Bulldogs expected to take second and the Wolves projected to be a rather tame third.

But this year's Wolves didn't believe in the pre-hype, they just believed in themselves. With the largest team entry in the meet, the Aqua Wolves utilized every swim in their program to pull off the biggest upset of this school year so far. Senior Captain Colin Babcock was voted by the coaches the Male Swimmer of the Meet, on the merits of his dominant double wins in the 200 individual medley and the 500 freestyle and leading the 200 free relay to a team record and second place finish and the 400 free relay to a decisive victory to close out the meet. But this upset was not just the work of one outstanding swimmer, it was a triumph for LaSallian athletics. Every swimmer on the team competed and all twenty-four had at least one best time.
