The Gulf Coast Athletic Conference announced that Sean Bennett a member of the Loyola Men's Basketball Team was named to the Pre-Season All Conference Team. Sean is a Saint Paul's graduate of 2006, and last season was an All-Gulf Coast Athletic Conference selection. He averaged fourteen points per game last season, finishing with a total of 415 points. He played in twenty-nine of the thirty games helping to lead the Wolfpack to a nineteen win season. He led the conference in free throws and scored seventy-seven points from behind the three point arc, second in the conference. In the first two games of the 2009-10, he has scored fifty points, garnered three steals, four rebounds, and four assists. Included in his point score are eleven shots from behind the three point line.

Saint Paul's School celebrated Veteran's Day with a special Principal's Assembly on November 10. Captain Andre Jeansonne, class of 94, and one of five Jeansonne brothers who are graduates, attended the assembly as a special guest. Captain Jeansonne enlisted in the Louisiana National Guard in 2000 as a member of the Third Infantry and served in Iraq. He returned home and attended flight school and now is a member of the 1-244th Assault Helicopter Battalion. Last year he returned to Iraq flying a UH 60A Blackhawk Helicopter. In Iraq he met two other Saint Paul's graduates, Captain Roger Keller '97, and Major Michael Englehardt '94. Captain Jeansonne presented the school with a flag that he had taken on a mission in his aircraft. He is now stationed in Hammond, Louisiana and continues to fly. He was awarded a Bronze Star and an Air Force Medal for his extraordinary service. Captain Jeansonne is pictured with Student Council President, Colin Babcock, who accepted the flag on behalf of the student body.



The Office of Development and its Planned Giving Committee will be happy to assist you in matters of planned giving.

**Endowment Fund Gifts:** Endowment Fund gifts guarantee the long-term viability of the school by providing an ongoing source of funds for academic programs, tuition assistance, capital improvements, and for retaining highly qualified faculty and staff.

**Gifts-In-Kind:** Gifts of equipment, furniture, or services relieve pressure on school budgets by providing needed resources without requiring capital outlay from the school.

**Pro Bono Gifts:** Gifts of time and talent provide the school with expert professional services at little or no cost.

**Restricted Gifts and Grants:** These donations are restricted by the donor to a specific department or program.
