GRANDPARENTS DAY



To All Saint Paul's Alumni,

Your Alumni Association Board is continuing the efforts that began several years ago to extend its reach to alumni who have not recently been active and to broaden the range of ways in which they can participate in all things Saint Paul's. One of the first tasks we tackled with the able leadership of our Vice-President John Curren, was to restate and update the Mission Statement, with the following result:

The mission of the Saint Paul's School Alumni Association is to:

- ◆ **enhance good fellowship among alumni and the entire Saint Paul's family**
- ◆ **provide a liaison for alumni to reconnect and strengthen their bonds with Saint Paul's so that the School's unique legacy, traditions, and character endure forever**
- ◆ **promote and be a force of pride for Saint Paul's in the community**
- ◆ **encourage all associated with Saint Paul's to at all times perpetuate and function in the LaSallian spirit**

The Mission Statement is now an integral part of the By-Laws of the Alumni Association and we, as a Board, are committed to live out the mission statement in the work we undertake on behalf of the Association. There is a long-term challenge alluded to in the mission statement and faced by the school to which I believe we must all respond in order to strengthen the institution that we know and love through its second hundred years. This is the decline in vocations to the Brothers of the Christian Schools. If you recall your Saint Paul's experience, you cannot deny that it was shaped by the men who dedicated themselves to the principals of Saint John Baptist de La Salle. No, I'm not suggesting that we can reverse the trend in vocations, though we should all pray for discernment of vocations among our sons and grandsons. But we can pray for and seek a part of the spirit of Saint John Baptist de La Salle and carry that with us as ambassadors of Saint Paul's.

This is the "secret sauce" that has through the efforts of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, made Saint Paul's the school that it is. The leadership within the Brothers recognized years ago that planting and cultivating this understanding within the lay faculty was key to the long-term continuation of the education process that uniquely marks Saint Paul's and other schools under their stewardship. This same thought process should lead anyone in a leadership role associated with the school to seek such training. To that end, your Alumni Board has committed to spend an upcoming Saturday morning seeking this spirit and understanding, with the aid and assistance of Charlie Legendre and a number of faculty members trained in the LaSallian philosophy. In the case of your Alumni Board, we hope that it will better enable us to fully effect the Mission Statement.

In Charlie's view, the graduating class of 2010 is the first class that has fully benefitted from their training. If you ask one of these young men for their understanding of Saint LaSalle's role in their education, you'll get quite a lecture. It's a central component of our experience that most of us "earlier graduates" can't verbalize, yet it's one that we should be able to communicate to anyone who asks us what is special about Saint Paul's. What we seek is the conscious understanding and ability to clearly describe the approach to education that shaped our time at Saint Paul's and that will, through our joint efforts, continue to constitute the "secret sauce" that distinguishes Saint Paul's and other LaSallian schools.

I hope to recount for you our experience in an upcoming edition of Wolf Tracks.
