Our History

Since 1680 educational institutions in more than eighty countries have been influenced by the vision and innovative spirit of Saint John Baptist de La Salle, the Founder of the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools and the patron saint of teachers. De La Salle transformed education by forming a community of educators with whom he developed a spirituality of teaching and learning, to give a human and Christian education to young people, especially the poor.

Lasallian Education centers on Catholic values and personal relationships, emphasizing academic excellence, faith formation, inclusion, respect for the individual, service and social justice. A Lasallian Education strives to enrich each student's cultural, intellectual, physical, social and spiritual development.

In 1911, the Benedictines of Saint Joseph Abbey purchased Dixon Academy in Covington. Its first session began with forty-eight students and the school quickly won a reputation for excellent instruction and strong discipline. Before the end of the first year, enrollment had grown to seventy boarders and thirty day students.

The Benedictines sold the school to the Brothers of the Christian Schools, the Christian Brothers in 1918. They were first represented here by nineteen French Brothers who had been exiled from both France and Mexico for political reasons. These pioneer Brothers worked long hours, not only teaching and guiding their students, but also staffing the school as carpenters, painters, plumbers, electricians, and yardmen. Inspired by the zeal of the founding Brothers, Saint Paul's has prospered. Saint Paul's has maintained its reputation for educational excellence established by the Benedictines and the founding Brothers.

Beginning in 2018, we celebrate 100 years of Christian Brothers' Lasallian Education at Saint Paul's School. While the physical plant has undergone many changes over the past 100 years, the Core Principles of our founding father remain the cornerstone of a Saint Paul's education. Where Dixon Hall once stood, we now welcome 880 students each day at Founder's Circle to study biomedical science, engineering, law, media production, and robotics along with the traditional curriculum courses to form young men with those same Lasallian values set forth that first day in 1918.

We look forward to continuing the tradition of integrating our core values of academic excellence, faith formation, inclusive community, respect for all persons, and social justice into the second century of Lasallian education.



1911 - The Benedictine Fathers from St. Joseph Abbey, purchase Dixon Academy for \$28, 306 to start a Catholic boys school. They name the school Saint Paul's College and opened on September 14, 1911 with 48 students. Father Augustine was the named as the first principal.



1918 - The Brothers of the Christian Schools (The Christian Brothers) enter into a lease-to-own contract with the Benedictines for \$2,500 per year for 15 years. Nineteen brothers formed the original community of brothers and Br. Nilammon Laurent was the first director.



1926 - Bronze statue of the Sacred Heart is donated by the Seniors of 1926. The statue was destroyed in the fire of Dixon Hall in 1981. Our Lady of Lourdes grotto is built.

New Gymnasium

According to LHSAA regulations, a 5A school must have a gym with the capacity to seat 1000 to be able to host a playoff game. The older gymnasium could only seat 870. In December of 2014, work began on the addition to the Gene Bennett Sports Complex. This 19,500 square foot air conditioned facility provides for this needed space.



As a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, PLTW exists to prepare students for the global economy through its world-class curriculum, high quality professional development, and an engaged network of educators, students, universities and professionals. PLTW's comprehensive curriculum has been collaboratively designed by PLTW teachers, university educators, engineering and biomedical professionals, and school administrators to promote critical thinking, creativity, innovation and real-world problem solving skills. STEM-centered or specialized academies. PTE is designed to prepare students to pursue a post-secondary education and careers in STEM-related fields. Saint Paul's is a certified PLTW Engineering School.



Pontchartrain Cancer Center Biomedical Science Program: The Biomedical Sciences Program (BMS) is intended for grades nine through twelve and explores human medicine, bioinformatics, cell biology, genetics, diseases, and other biomedical topics

Topics in biology, chemistry and physics are covered through problem-based learning about diseases, the human body, atoms, and electricity.
