Our History

Since 1680 educational institutions in more than eighty countries have been influenced by the vision and innovative spirit of Saint John Baptist de La Salle, the Founder of the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools and the patron saint of teachers. De La Salle transformed education by forming a community of educators with whom he developed a spirituality of teaching and learning, to give a human and Christian education to young people, especially the poor.

Lasallian Education centers on Catholic values and personal relationships, emphasizing academic excellence, faith formation, inclusion, respect for the individual, service and social justice. A Lasallian Education strives to enrich each student's cultural, intellectual, physical, social and spiritual development.

In 1911, the Benedictines of Saint Joseph Abbey purchased Dixon Academy in Covington. Its first session began with forty-eight students and the school quickly won a reputation for excellent instruction and strong discipline. Before the end of the first year, enrollment had grown to seventy boarders and thirty day students.

The Benedictines sold the school to the Brothers of the Christian Schools, the Christian Brothers in 1918. They were first represented here by nineteen French Brothers who had been exiled from both France and Mexico for political reasons. These pioneer Brothers worked long hours, not only teaching and guiding their students, but also staffing the school as carpenters, painters, plumbers, electricians, and yardmen. Inspired by the zeal of the founding Brothers, Saint Paul's has prospered. Saint Paul's has maintained its reputation for educational excellence established by the Benedictines and the founding Brothers.

Beginning in 2018, we celebrate 100 years of Christian Brothers' Lasallian Education at Saint Paul's School. While the physical plant has undergone many changes over the past 100 years, the Core Principles of our founding father remain the cornerstone of a Saint Paul's education. Where Dixon Hall once stood, we now welcome 880 students each day at Founder's Circle to study biomedical science, engineering, law, media production, and robotics along with the traditional curriculum courses to form young men with those same Lasallian values set forth that first day in 1918.

We look forward to continuing the tradition of integrating our core values of academic excellence, faith formation, inclusive community, respect for all persons, and social justice into the second century of Lasallian education.

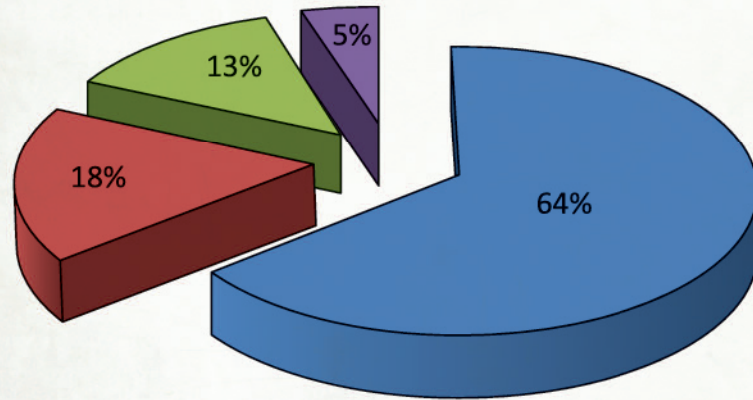

1911 - The Benedictine Fathers from St. Joseph Abbey, purchase Dixon Academy for \$28, 306 to start a Catholic boys school. They name the school Saint Paul's College and opened on September 14, 1911 with 48 students. Father Augustine was the named as the first principal.



1918 - The Brothers of the Christian Schools (The Christian Brothers) enter into a lease-to-own contract with the Benedictines for \$2,500 per year for 15 years. Nineteen brothers formed the original community of brothers and Br. Nilammon Laurent was the first director.



1926 - Bronze statue of the Sacred Heart is donated by the Seniors of 1926. The statue was destroyed in the fire of Dixon Hall in 1981. Our Lady of Lourdes grotto is built.

1926-1929 - A new music building was constructed; a new wing was added to the infirmary, and the kitchen was remodeled to include a walk in refrigerator.



1930 - St. Paul's College arch is erected and donated by the classes of 1929 and 1930. The archway was destroyed in 1962 in order to enlarge the roadway in and out of the property.



1934 - The first St. Paul's summer camp was created to earn money to pay the expenses of operating the plant.

1935 - The football rivalry between Covington High (formerly Lyon High) and Saint Paul's begins.

1941-1944 - There was a rapid increase of boarders due mainly to the involvement of the United States in World War II after December 7, 1941. Boys as young as 8 years old were taken care of by the Brothers.

1945 - St. Paul's track team came out first in nearly every entered meet. They became state champions this year.



1946 - The cafeteria was renovated with surplus World War II supplies. A modern steam table was acquired which changed the system of serving meals to the students into a cafeteria style system.



1948 - Br. August spearheaded the first master plan expansion of facilities for St. Paul's School and officially opened the first capital campaign called "St. Paul Expansion Program".

1948 - Br. Cassian Lange becomes Director-Principal.



1950 - The Main School Building is built and Camp St. Paul was revived after being defunct for several years. It was a boarding camp for boys 8 to 13 years old and helped raise funds to operate the plant. A new infirmary is built (currently the Development/Alumni Offices).

1950 - Dixon Hall becomes a dormitory with a new record of 165 boarders registered. 107 day students are enrolled.

1951 - Br. Honore (one of the original nineteen brothers in 1918) passes away. During those 33 years, he taught music.

1952-1953 - Enrollment continues to increase to 350 students, both boarders and day students.

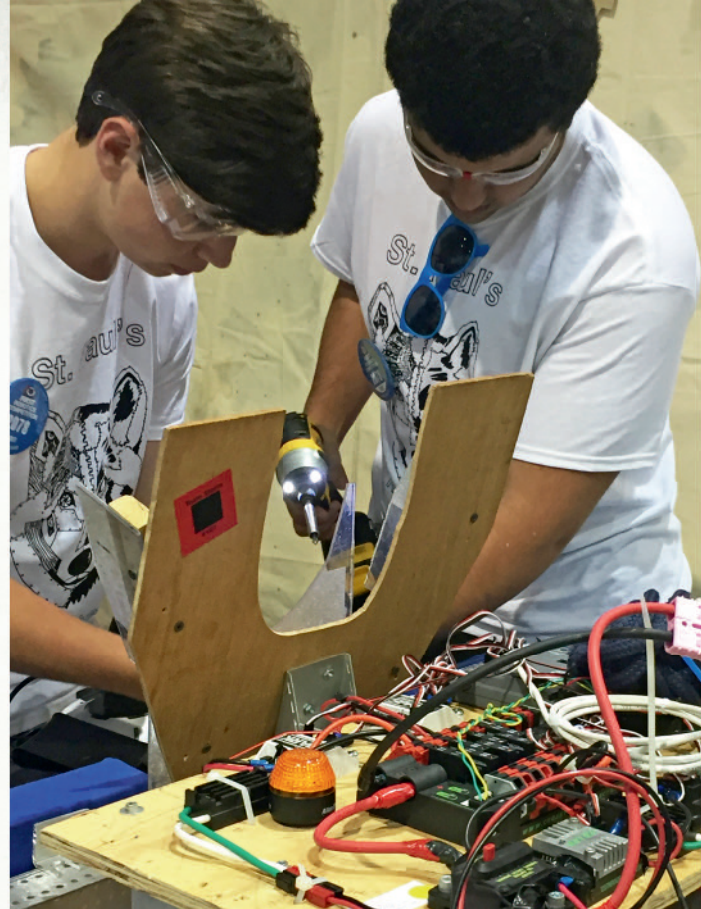

New Gymnasium

Cost 4.5 Million

With the continuing expansion of the student body, the need for additional indoor gymnasium space became evident. According to LHSAA regulations, a 5A school must have a gym with the capacity to seat 1000 to be able to host a playoff game. The older gymnasium could only seat 870. In December of 2014, work began on the addition to the Gene Bennett Sports Complex. This 19,500 square foot air conditioned facility provides for this needed space.

As a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, PLTW exists to prepare students for the global economy through its world-class curriculum, high quality professional development, and an engaged network of educators, students, universities and professionals. PLTW's comprehensive curriculum has been collaboratively designed by PLTW teachers, university educators, engineering and biomedical professionals, and school administrators to promote critical thinking, creativity, innovation and real-world problem solving skills. The hands-on, project-based program engages students on multiple levels, exposes them to areas of study that they typically do not pursue, and provides them with a foundation and proven path to college and career success. Saint Paul's offers four high school PLTW programs:



The Hornbeck Offshore Pathway To Engineering Program: Pathway To Engineering (PTE) is intended for grades nine through twelve. PTE explores the design process and links STEM principles to relevant problem-solving activities. Courses complement traditional mathematics and science courses and can serve as the foundation for STEM-centered or specialized academies. PTE is designed to prepare students to pursue a post-secondary education and careers in STEM-related fields. Saint Paul's is a certified PLTW Engineering School.



Pontchartrain Cancer Center Biomedical Science Program: The Biomedical Sciences Program (BMS) is intended for grades nine through twelve and explores human medicine, bioinformatics, cell biology, genetics, diseases, and other biomedical topics

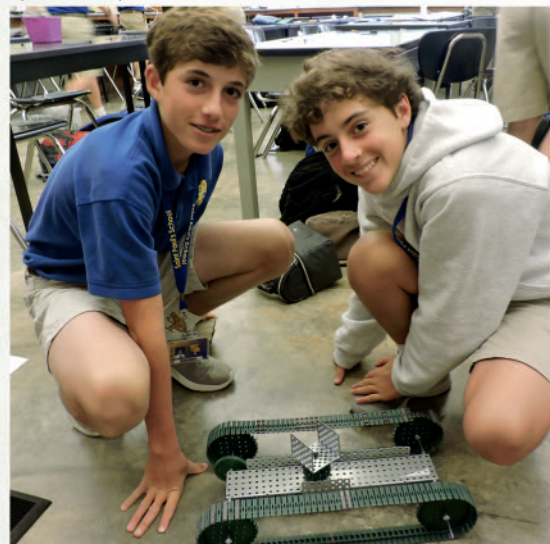

Computer Science: At a time when computer science affects how we work and live, PLTW Computer Science empowers students in grades nine through twelve to become creators, instead of merely customers, of the technology all around them. The program's interdisciplinary courses engage in compelling, real-world challenges. As students work together to design solutions, they learn computational thinking - not just how to code - and become better thinkers and communicators. The Hornbeck Offshore Gateway to Technology Program: Designed for pre-freshmen grade students, Gateway to Technology introduces students to a variety of concepts in science, math, engineering and technology as preparation for further development throughout high school. Students use design software and robotics to solve real-world problems as well as develop communication and collaboration skills. Topics in biology, chemistry and physics are covered through problem-based learning about diseases, the human body, atoms, and electricity.

2015 - A new gymnasium is added to the Gene Bennett Sports Complex providing an air-conditioned facility that seats 1100.

2017 - School enrollment has grown to 890 students on over 40 acres in downtown Covington. The physical plant includes 3 multi-story buildings, two gyms, a theater, cafeteria, chapel, maintenance building, 2 administrative buildings, an assembly center, football and baseball facilities, and a retirement home. The school also owns multiple residential homes around the campus. The next building to undergo renovations will be Benilde Hall.
