**Curriculum Enhancements:** Through the generosity of Hornbeck Offshore, we are adding the following courses:

**Engineering Development and Design:** This is the capstone Project Lead the Way course, taken by seniors who have progressed through the engineering curriculum. From the PLTW website: *The knowledge and skills students acquire throughout PLTW Engineering come together in EDD as they identify an issue and then research, design, and test a solution, ultimately presenting their solution to a panel of engineers. Students apply the professional skills they have developed to document a design process to standards, completing EDD ready to take on any post-secondary program or career.*

**Petroleum Engineering:** We already have civil and electrical courses, so we figured that since Louisiana is so dependent upon the petroleum industry that we should add this course as well.

**Accounting:** This course will enhance our business curriculum offerings along with Marketing, Management, Economics, Finance and Entrepreneurship.

We could not have afforded these new programs while maintaining the rest of the engineering and business curricula without the support of Covington-based Hornbeck Offshore Services and five of its top executives (all of whom are SPS dads). We begin our second year of a five year partnership, in which HOS and its executives collectively pledged \$500,000 and other in-kind support toward a strategic academic endowment of our business and PLTW engineering professional curricula here at SPS. **I am again grateful to Todd & Donna Hornbeck, Jim & Pam Harp, John & Nikki Cook, Tim and Lisa McCarthy and Sam & Jill Giberga. - **Tuition was due on June 1st. If you financed tuition with Resource Bank, the first bank payment was also due in June.**
- **Late tuition is subject to a 1% finance charge.**

**Summer Reading and Virtual Bookstore:** From Assistant Principal Joe Dickens:

*Welcome to a new school year. This is a reminder that all students have summer reading assignments for English, and students who are enrolled in an **honors or A.P.** social studies course do as well. Please take note of the following to ensure that your son completes these assignments as efficiently as possible.*

*To make obtaining his English reading materials as facile as possible, our virtual bookstore opened for summer reading and for the school year on May 29. Any novel, play, or workbook he will need for English will be listed including new and used editions, and in some cases, eBooks. We offer this service for convenience, variety, and savings.*

*Simply go to our website at [www.stpauls.com](http://www.stpauls.com), click the "Order Your Books Here" button on the left, and you'll be directed to our virtual bookstore. You'll choose his titles for summer reading and for the school year based on his placement in English. Payment will be handled on-line through MBS Direct, and the books will be shipped by UPS straight to your home.*

### **The First Day of School on Thursday, August 6:**

- **Thursday, August 6, is a FULL DAY OF CLASS INSTRUCTION.** Here's the plan:
  - Books will be in the classrooms and teachers will distribute them directly to students during the first class meeting;
  - Pictures and ID cards will be taken and issued during religion classes during the first two days (Aug 6-7). You will be sent information for ordering pictures.
  - The cafeteria will be open M – W, Aug 3-5, from 7-2:30 for you to place money on deposit if your son will be using the Archdiocesan Food Service. Students must have money on account for them to receive food from the cafeteria. Breakfast is served for \$1.25 and lunch for \$2.25. It's a bargain – unless your son loads up with extra servings! And don't let your son say "the line is too long." After the first few days last year, all students were served within twenty minutes.
- The complete 2015-16 calendar can be found on our web site ([www.stpauls.com](http://www.stpauls.com)). NOTE: To comply with the State of Louisiana attendance policy, we are vigilant in insisting that students not miss school. **PLEASE DO NOT SCHEDULE VACATIONS DURING SCHOOL TIME.**
- And speaking of Edline, in late-July we'll send Edline codes and SPS email addresses to new students to activate their accounts. Edline allows parents to check grades and assignments and to communicate with teachers. We want ALL parents to activate their Edline accounts to receive important info from the teachers.
- NOTE: All students must wear their DRESS UNIFORM on either Aug 6 OR 7 – the days they will take school pictures. Pictures will be taken during RELIGION CLASSES, so if your son's religion class is during Period A, B C or D, he wears his dress uniform on Thu, Aug 6. If his religion class is during Period E, F, or G, he wears his uniform on Fri, Aug 7. How will you know? The schedule we will email you will indicate the religion period.

**Mothers Club Book Store:** The Bookstore will be open on Monday, August 3rd from 9:00 am - 6:00 pm, and Tuesday - Wednesday, August 4th-5th, from 9:00 am - 4:00 pm. All required school supplies will be available for purchase, as well as St. Paul's apparel. Students who ordered the Pre-Pack supplies will be able to pick up their orders during this time.

Save time and money by purchasing a "Health Supply" package from the Mothers' Club! We will provide your son's teacher with his required tissues, paper towels, hand sanitizer, Clorox wipes, Lysol wipes and baby wipes throughout the year! Packages will go on sale August 3rd and may be purchased in the Bookstore for \$10.00. We will let your teachers know that you have purchased your health supplies.

Our regular bookstore hours of operation will start on Thursday, August 6th.

**Cafeteria and Free / Reduced Lunch Program:** If you wish to apply for free / reduced lunch, you can now do so on-line. There is NO stigma in applying and NO ONE knows. Nothing is done to embarrass your son or identify him as a free / reduced student. From the Archdiocesan Food Service:

*Applying for your child(ren)'s school meal benefits is now faster, safer & easier than ever. To apply please visit our website at: [www.schoolcafe.org](http://www.schoolcafe.org) and click on the link "Click Here to Apply for Reduced/Free Lunch" on the home page to begin your application. This service is provided to you free of charge by School Food & Nutrition Services of the Archdiocese of New Orleans.*

*Entering your application online is quicker, easier, and more accurate than filling out a paper application. Our step-by-step process and guided help makes applying for school meals simpler and easier to understand than ever before. Processing times are faster; therefore benefits are applied quicker too!*

*Listed below is what you will need to provide during the on-line application process:*

- *The names and incomes of every member of your household*
- *The school, grade, & birth date of every student in your household*
- *Your social security number and electronic signature*
- *A valid email address and phone number for communication purposes about the status of the application.*

**Service Hours:** Summer is a great time for your son to start and even complete his service hour requirement of 10 hours. Remember that service hours must be done for those in need. Doing chores around the house does not qualify – your son should already be doing chores around the house. We are particularly stressing this year the need to help the truly needy. The Covington Food Bank, Habitat, parish mission trips, nursing homes – all of these provide legitimate service hour opportunities.

Remember that two special awards are given at the end of the year for service hours: The Brother Alfred Service Award for 50+ service hours and the Order of Saint La Salle Award for 100+ service hours. I'm always edified by the number of students who qualify for these awards. Let's aim for 100% of the student body earning these awards this year!

**Class Schedules: Schedules will be emailed (if tuition is paid or bank payments current) by July 20 or very shortly thereafter.**

**Dress Code:** Here it is again. I reiterate: the school is the final judge of uniform compliance:

- ONLY SPS sweatshirts/outerwear will be allowed in cool / cold weather EVEN FOR SENIORS.
- ONLY **regular tan** khaki pants / shorts (NO cargo) will be allowed. If the pants are too light or too dark, we will insist that the student buy tan khaki ones. Some students were "pushing the envelope" last year with this rule, so make sure they pants are TAN – otherwise we may have to mandate a specific brand of pants/shorts. We have a

supply of slightly used pants/shorts which I am happy to give away. Please approach me if your budget is tight. Your son will not be embarrassed in any way.

- ONLY shirts sold by Bayou Uniform (13488 Seymour Myers Blvd) are allowed. If your son's shirts have shrunk (shirt tails MUST stay tucked in) or have holes, he MUST buy new ones.
- ONLY **white, blue, gray, or gold T-shirts** may be worn under uniform shirt.
- ONLY PLAIN (no metal decorations) BROWN belts will be allowed.
- SPS socks will still be required. These can be purchased at Bayou Uniform or in the bookstore.
- **We have a supply of slightly used SPS shirts and sweatshirts (in good condition) which I am happy to give away. Please approach me if your budget is tight. You and your son will not be embarrassed in any way.**
- We will continue to use the "formal" uniform on special occasions (school masses, ceremonies, etc). This uniform will include a school tie (purchased at Bayou Uniform) and ANY plain, white long-sleeve dress shirt. Long khakis with dark shoes, socks and belt are also part of the uniform which are purchased anywhere by the student.
- **AGAIN THIS YEAR:** As an additional level of safety, students will be REQUIRED to WEAR THEIR ID CARDS on a daily basis. We will supply them with an SPS lanyard when they received their cards on either Aug 6 or 7. This will also help with the cafeteria, as ID cards are used to check out and also with the attendance office, as ID cards are used to check in.

**Attention Seniors:** The St. Tammany Clerk of Court's office is recruiting and training high school seniors as certified election commissioners. 17 and 18-year-olds enrolled in 12<sup>th</sup> grade can earn \$200 for working election day! With elections scheduled in St. Tammany in October and November, **commissioner certification classes will be held August 14, August 17 and August 26, soon after the start of the 2015-2016 school year. You only need to attend one of the sessions.** More info will be sent later and senior civics teachers will have details. Call Pat Lincoln at the Clerk's Office at 809-8724 if you have any questions or concerns.

**Football:** Football camp for varsity begins July 28<sup>th</sup> and concludes July 31<sup>st</sup>. Incoming freshman meet at 7am on Monday, July 13<sup>th</sup> for practice with physical clearance. Pre-freshman sign up for football is Tuesday, August 4th (spirit night) at 5pm in the gym.

**Band:** The Marching Wolves invite ALL students to consider joining one of the premier band programs in the area. **Even beginners are welcome!** Note the following:

- A new member orientation will be held on Mon and Tue, July 20 & 21, from 9 – 4 and Wed, July 22, from 9 - 2. Come join the Marching Wolves. It's a great experience
- All percussion members are also to report for these three days.
- Full band camp is Mon, July 27 – Fri, July 31, from 9 – 6.

**Athletics:** From the Athletic Director, Coach Craig Ketelsen:

- Any student who wishes to play a sport must have his athletic paperwork (including a physical on a school medical history form) turned in to the office BEFORE the start of practices. Football, CC, and Swimming will begin the first week of school for new students.

**Annual Fund:** Thanks to those of you who have contributed. Even during the summer, I continue to get donations. **If you still haven't contributed and are able to, even to a small degree, please do so now so, as the 2015 Annual Fund Drive ends July 31.** Thanks. So far, we have used the funds to provide continuing education opportunities for faculty members, to upgrade technology, to fund curricula, and to help pay for the new gym.

**Safe Environment Training:** SPS will host an Archdiocese of New Orleans-sponsored Safe Environment Training Course on Monday, July 13<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm in the Alumni Memorial Theater. The training lasts about 90 minutes and is mandated for all who have direct supervision of young people. Thus, all our faculty and staff, along with parents who are in regular contact with students, have gone through the training, which is good for three years. There is no charge for the training. **Proof of Attendance and Driver's License:** If your son is getting his driver's license this summer, state law requires you to provide the DMV with a Proof of Attendance form. These forms are available here in the Administration Building. If you go to DMV without one, they will turn you away – even if you've sat there for an hour or more! And make sure it's signed in blue ink or they will turn you away, too! And don't blame me for this regulation! It was a legislative act.
