New SPS Parents: Two special events are held for our new parents to welcome and orient them. Please note:

- Mothers' Club New Mom Social will be held Tue, Aug 8 at 6:30 pm in the Briggs Assembly Center. This is a wonderful opportunity to become acquainted with our fantastic Mothers' Club and to be welcomed into the family of SPS.

All new parents are welcomed and encouraged to attend this event at which you will meet the key people involved with your sons' education and receive important information in the process. **Curriculum Enhancements:** In continuing our response to the needs and wishes of our students, we have added the following courses to our curriculum for next year:

- Algebra III: This is another dual enrollment class with Southeastern where our students can earn college
  credit. It's a computer -based college algebra course taught over the whole school year which
  strives to strengthen algebraic concepts by introducing both the concepts and real life applications
  of these concepts. In addition, in the fall semester students will review and practice ACT skills
  including basic geometry and trigonometry among others.
- Accounting: This course will enhance our business curriculum offerings along with Marketing, Management, Economics, Finance and Entrepreneurship. We remain grateful to the executive team of Hornbeck Offshore Services for sponsoring our engineering and business curricula.
- **Speech III**: This is a course in persuasive writing.
- Law Studies II: Our law studies program continues to grow, so we are pleased to add a second year of study in this area. Law Studies I is a prerequisite to Law Studies II. This course is a continuation of Law Studies I, with students continuing their study of legal concepts covered in Law Studies I, but in a more in depth manner.

- Tuition was due on June 1st. If you financed tuition with Resource Bank, the first bank payment was also due in June.
- Late tuition is subject to a 1% finance charge. Late loan payments will incur bank charges.

#### Summer Reading and Virtual Bookstore: From Assistant Principal Joe Dickens:

Welcome to a new school year. This is a reminder that all students have summer reading assignments for English, and students who are enrolled in an **honors or A.P.** social studies course do as well. Please take note of the following to ensure that your son completes these assignments as efficiently as possible.

To make obtaining his English reading materials as facile as possible, our virtual bookstore opened for summer reading and for the school year on May 29. Any novel, play, or workbook he will need for English will be listed including new and used editions, and in some cases, eBooks. We offer this service for convenience, variety, and savings.

Simply go to our website at <u>www.stpauls.com</u>, click the "Order Your Books Here" button on the left, and you'll be directed to our virtual bookstore. You'll choose his titles for summer reading and for the school year based on his placement in English. Payment will be handled on-line through MBS Direct, and the books will be shipped by UPS straight to your home.

Next, all summer reading questions for English and social studies (if your son is in honors or AP history/civics) are posted on our website. Please note that your son will independently have to obtain his own summer reading books for social studies if he is in honors or AP. Click on the link for summer reading at the bottom of our homepage, www.stpauls.com, and find the class(es) applicable to your son.

### The First Day of School on Monday, August 8:

- Monday, August 8 is a FULL DAY OF CLASS INSTRUCTION. Here's the plan:
  - o Books will be in the classrooms and teachers will distribute them directly to students during the first class meeting;
  - Pictures and ID cards will be taken and issued during religion classes during the first two days (Aug 8 & 9). You will be sent information for ordering pictures.
  - o The cafeteria will be open W F, Aug 3 5, from 7-2:30 for you to place money on deposit if your son will be using the Archdiocesan Food Service. Students must have money on account for them to receive food from the cafeteria. Breakfast is served for \$1.50 and lunch for \$2.50. It's a bargain unless your son loads up with extra servings! And don't let your son say "the line is too long." After the first few days last year, all students were served within twenty minutes.
- The complete 2016 17 calendar can be found on our web site (www.stpauls.com). NOTE: To comply with the State of Louisiana attendance policy, we are vigilant in insisting that students not miss school. Please do not schedule vacations during school time.
- And speaking of Edline, in late-July we'll send Edline codes and SPS email addresses to new students to
  activate their accounts. Edline allows parents to check grades and assignments and to communicate with
  teachers. We want ALL parents to activate their Edline accounts to receive important info from the teachers.
- NOTE: All students must wear their DRESS UNIFORM on EITHER Aug 8 or 9 the days they will take school pictures. Pictures will be taken during RELIGION CLASSES, so if your son's religion class is during Period A, B C or D, he wears his dress uniform on Mon, Aug 8. If his religion class is during Period E, F, or G, he wears his uniform on Tue, Aug 9. How will you know? The schedule we will email you will indicate the religion period.

**Mothers' Club Book Store**: The Bookstore will be open during the week of August 1. Exact times will be sent later. All required school supplies will be available for purchase, as well as St. Paul's apparel.

Regular bookstore hours of operation will start on Monday, August 8.

**Cafeteria and Free / Reduced Lunch Program:** If you wish to apply for free / reduced lunch, you can now do so on-line. There is NO stigma in applying and NO ONE knows. Nothing is done to embarrass your son or identify him as a free / reduced student. From the Archdiocesan Food Service:

Applying for your child(ren)'s school meal benefits is now faster, safer & easier than ever. To apply please visit our website at: <a href="www.schoolcafe.org">www.schoolcafe.org</a> and click on the link "Click Here to Apply for Reduced/Free Lunch" on the home page to begin your application. This service is provided to you free of charge by School Food & Nutrition Services of the Archdiocese of New Orleans.

Entering your application online is quicker, easier, and more accurate than filling out a paper application. Our step-by-step process and guided help makes applying for school meals simpler and easier to understand than ever before. Processing times are faster; therefore benefits are applied quicker too!

Listed below is what you will need to provide during the on-line application process:

- The names and incomes of every member of your household
- The school, grade, & birth date of every student in your household
- Your social security number and electronic signature
- A valid email address and phone number for communication purposes about the status of the application.

**Service Hours:** Summer is a great time for your son to start and even complete his service hour requirement of 10 hours. Remember that service hours must be done for those in need. Doing chores around the house does not qualify – your son should already be doing chores around the house. We are particularly stressing this year the need to help the truly needy. The Covington Food Bank, Habitat, parish mission trips, nursing homes – all of these provide legitimate service hour opportunities.

Remember that two special awards are given at the end of the year for service hours: The Brother Alfred Service Award for 50+ service hours and the Order of Saint La Salle Award for 100+ service hours. I'm always edified by the number of students who qualify for these awards. Let's aim for 100% of the student body earning these awards this year!

**Dress Code:** Here it is again. I reiterate: the school is the final judge of uniform compliance:

• ONLY SPS sweatshirts/outerwear will be allowed in cool / cold weather EVEN FOR SENIORS.

- ONLY **regular tan** khaki pants / shorts (NO cargo) will be allowed. If the pants are too light or too dark, we will insist that the student buy tan khaki ones. Some students were "pushing the envelope" last year with this rule, so make sure they pants are TAN otherwise we may have to mandate a specific brand of pants/shorts. We have a supply of slightly used pants/shorts which I am happy to give away. Please approach me if your budget is tight. Your son will not be embarrassed in any way.
- ONLY shirts sold by Bayou Uniform (13488 Seymour Myers Blvd) are allowed. If your son's shirts have shrunk (shirt tails MUST stay tucked in) or have holes, he MUST buy new ones.
- ONLY white, blue, gray, or gold T-shirts may be worn under uniform shirt.
- ONLY PLAIN (no metal decorations) BROWN belts will be allowed.
- SPS WHITE socks will still be required. The multi-colored socks that made an appearance last year will no longer be allowed. These white socks can be purchased at Bayou Uniform or in the bookstore.
- We will continue to use the "formal" uniform on special occasions (school masses, ceremonies, etc). This uniform will include a school tie (purchased at Bayou Uniform) and ANY plain, white long-sleeve dress shirt. Long khakis with dark shoes, socks and belt are also part of the uniform which are purchased anywhere by the student.
- AGAIN THIS YEAR: As an additional level of safety, students will be REQUIRED to WEAR THEIR ID CARDS on a daily basis. We will supply them with an SPS lanyard when they received their cards on either Aug 8 or 9. This will also help with the cafeteria, as ID cards are used to check out and also with the attendance office, as ID cards are used to check in.

**Football:** Football camp for varsity begins July 26<sup>th</sup> and concludes July 29th. Incoming freshman meet at 7am on Monday, July 11th for practice with physical clearance. Pre-freshman signup for football is Tuesday, August 2nd (spirit night) at 5pm in the gym.

**Band:** The Marching Wolves invite ALL students to consider joining one of the premier band programs in the area. **Even beginners are welcome!** Note the following:

- Our New Member Camp will be July 18-20. Monday and Tuesday 18 & 19 are 9:00am- 4:00pm and Wednesday the 20th 9:00 am Noon. It is bring your own Lunch
- Band camp for all members is July 25-29. Monday Thursday is 9:00AM-6:00 PM and Friday 8:00AM-6:00 PM
- Band members must have physicals for participation.

Athletics: From the Athletic Director, Coach Craig Ketelsen:

Any student who wishes to play a sport must have his athletic paperwork (including a physical on a school
medical history form) turned in to the office BEFORE the start of practices. Football, CC, and Swimming
will begin the first week of school for new students.

Annual Fund: Thanks to those of you who have contributed. Even during the summer, I continue to get donations. If you still haven't contributed and are able to, even to a small degree, please do so now so, as the 2016 Annual Fund Drive ends July 31. Thanks. So far, we have used the funds to provide continuing education opportunities for faculty members, to upgrade technology, to fund curricula, and to help pay for the new gym.
