

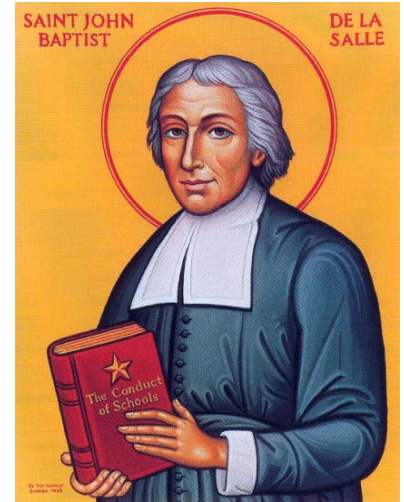


*The President's Hebdomadal **Blue Ribbon** Newsletter* *Nov 07 - 13, 2016 in the Jubilee Year of Mercy*

Millenials and School Choice: If given the opportunity to select whatever school they could for their child, more millennials (considered to apply to individuals who reached adulthood around the turn of the 21st century) would prefer a private school than any other option, according to a national poll released October 11 by EdChoice, formerly the Friedman Foundation for Educational Choice. Asked “If it were your decision and you could select any type of school, and financial costs and transportation were of no concern, what type of school would you select in order to obtain the best education for your child?” 43 percent of millennials said they would select a private school (including independent, parochial, and religious); 28 percent would choose a regular public school; 13 percent, a home school; and 8 percent said they would choose a charter school.
