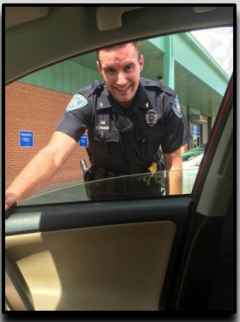
Chris Combs '98 – Chris and his wife Michelle welcomed their eighth child into the family, Luke Robert, on October 19th.

Saint Paul's School officially opened the renovated Benilde Hall on Thursday, September 27th with a blessing and reception. Student hosts, Grant Addison, Andrew Norlin, Trace Roberts, Joshua Rovira and Matthew Vicknair, welcomed members of the administration, board of trustees, faculty, and generous donors to the common area, Ben's Den, named for Ben Blanchard, a graduate of 2000. The display of historical items neatly arranged in the open view bookcases drew the attention of all the visitors, a wonderful display of items relevant to the past 107 years of Saint Paul's history.

The first floor houses a coffee area, research area, Mothers' Club Bookstore, classroom, campus minister's office and a designated work space for media and publication classes. The second floor classrooms are dedicated to Spanish and Social Studies instruction, and the third floor houses the religion department. The addition of the covered porches invite both students and faculty to enjoy the campus during lunch and free time, and new lighted tower displays both the Lasallian five pointed star, and the school crest.

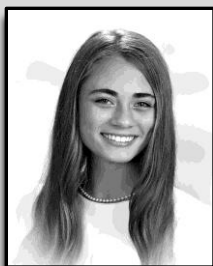
Members of the 2018 Homecoming Court are as follows:

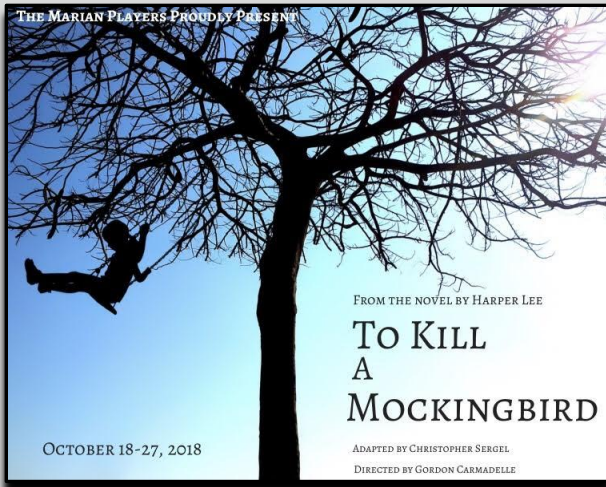
The Little Brown Jug

The team has garnered a number of awards since its start in 2015 including: 2016, 2017, 2018, Vex Robotics State Tournament Championship, and Excellence Award Winners. From 2015-2018 the team has traveled to Louisville, Kentucky to compete in the Vex World Robotics Competitions. The team is under the direction of Mrs. Julie Beck, a nationally certified PLTW Master Teacher and 2016 Outstanding PLTW Teacher of the Year, and Mrs. Marie Childs, a science instructor.

Saint Paul's offers a wide range of clubs, teams, and activities. One of the most recent is the Speech and Debate team. For years and years students had tried and failed to get the team started. There was always not enough interest or time to go to any tournaments or get anything started. Last year, however, the team went to five tournaments, including the state championship and National Finals. This year, the team is gearing up for another successful year. Members of the team include: Jack Ballard, Tyler Beard, Blake Bollinger, Cameron Dougherty, Hal Fox, Reece Grimley, Ian Kramer, Nash Rung and John Sheffield.

With new coaches Ms. Kim Gardner and Ms. Stefanie Beard, the team is gearing up for one of the largest tournaments in Louisiana and in the country at Holy Cross School. Hundreds of high students from all over the Southeast US will travel to participate, and the top five teams will qualify for the National Catholic Forensic League Grand Nationals, which Saint Paul's participated in last year. Saint Paul's Speech and Debaters are practicing multiple times a week, creating arguments, researching topics, and preparing to debate other cases.

The tournament is very important because it puts students on the map for colleges and scholarships. Speech and Debate is a very intellectually challenging activity, one which colleges look for in potential students as a measure of potential success. It is an activity that requires hours of preparation and innovative ideas, a perfect program for future lawyers and politicians, especially as most of the topics require public speaking skills and dealing with political issues.

The topic for Public Forum, a category of debate, is "The US should accede to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea without reservations." This topic, like every topic in Public Forum, is meant to educate anyone listening, or judging the round, about both sides of the topic, pro and con. Other members of the Speech and Debate team will be participating in topics such as Extemporaneous Speaking and Impromptu, styles of debate in which there is little to no preparation before the round and participants must write and give a speech within thirty minutes. Different members of the team excel at different things; however most participate in both Speech and Debate.

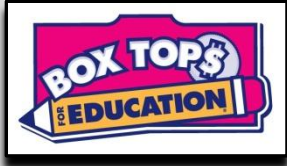
