
LDH Interim Guidance on Optional Shortened Quarantine for Close Contacts of COVID-19 Cases in Community (non-congregate living) Settings

The below flowchart describes options to shorten quarantine, however, 14 days is still the optimal quarantine period for minimizing the transmission of COVID-19. OPH recommends use of the 14-day quarantine period in in situations where exemptions to Louisiana'a mask mandate are allowed, including but not limited to, daycares and other school settings where masking among children is not maintained.



^{*}If quarantine is shortened, daily symptoms monitoring and strict adherence to prevention measures including social distancing, hand washing, and especially wearing masks/face covering, should continue until the full 14 days from last contact with a COVID-19 case. Close contacts who develop symptoms on or before day 14 after their last exposure to a COVID-19 case are considered suspect cases regardless of meeting criteria for a shortened guarantine and should self-isolate immediately.
