Brother Charles Crouzet, FSC Award

Brother Charles Crouzet was a founding Christian Brother at Saint Paul's School in 1918. He was a consummate educator: gentle, kind, totally committed to his students, innovative in approach and methodology, deeply spiritual and very humble. He was not one to draw attention to himself, but quietly went about his work, always striving to improve things, always working for the good of his students, always reliable and professional.

During the 2021 Academic Awards ceremony, Saint Paul's President, Brother Ray Bulliard, FSC, presented the Brother Charles Crouzet, FSC Award to two individuals: one for 2020 and one for 2021. The 2020 recipient of the award is Mr. Luke Barwick and Craig Ketelsen is the recipient for 2021.



Luke Barwick emulates the best qualities of Brother Charles. In fact, he did not choose teaching as his first profession, but was discerning a vocation as a priest in St. Joseph Abbey Seminary. Upon graduation, he decided not to pursue the priesthood, and decided to teach for a while until he decided what he really wanted to do. That was 21 years ago! He has convinced his sister to come work at Saint Paul's and his brother to move to Covington to assume the head of school position of another local Catholic School. Over the past almost 21 years of teaching at Saint Paul's, Mr. Luke Barwick has become a stalwart figure among our teachers. He has been the junior religion teacher for most of that time. But he adds so much more. He is a living example

of the five Lasallian core principles. But perhaps his students say it best. His final student evaluations contain the following comments from his current students: "Best class ever." "We learn a lot in this class from doing basic things. Coach Barwick is an invaluable part of SPS. He cares about each of his students." "Coach is the best teacher I could have ever asked for. Thank you for teaching me to be a man." "He has taught me valuable life lessons and has increased my faith life."

As Luke Barwick continues in his next twenty years at Saint Paul's, it is appropriate that we take a moment and recognize this outstanding Lasallian educator. Saint Paul's Religion Department, and, indeed, our entire school, have benefitted from his talents.



Craig Ketelsen began his teaching career fresh from SLU with a degree in social studies – and a passion for the sport of wrestling, inherited, no doubt, from his father — a nationally known wrestling coach who was the last head coach of wrestling at LSU. He was charged with building one of the best programs around — and he accomplished that and then some. For the majority of his Saint Paul's career, over 30 years, Coach Ketelsen served as head wrestling coach, and during that time he led his team to two state championships, twenty parish titles, ten district titles, and was twice named Louisiana State Coach of the Year. He has coached 20 individual state champions and five All-Americans during his career.

Craig Ketelsen has served as Athletic Director since 2002, and during his tenure has established a solid, competitive athletic program at Saint Paul's School. He successfully coordinated the transition of the athletic programs from the 4A level to 5A level overseeing 40 teams in sixteen sports at four age levels (Pre-Freshmen, Freshmen, Junior Varsity). Under his leadership, Saint Paul's teams captured 22 state titles in 10 different sports.

Over the past 33 years of teaching at Saint Paul's, Coach Craig Ketelsen has become a stalwart figure among our teachers. He is a living example of the five Lasallian core principles. Athletic Awards

Athletic Director Ketelsen began the major athletic awards program with a recap of the 2020-21 sports seasons. Saint Paul's had over 550 students participate in at least one sport. The teams combined to earn seven district titles, six regional championships, one parish title, two state runner-up titles and three state championships. Over forty individual athletes were named to all-district teams including, three most valuable players, and forty-one All Parish, All Region or All Metro athletes. Twelve students individually earned the title of state champion including one state Most Valuable Player.
