

**AFTER SCHOOL:** The Library remains open to students until 4 pm. If your son is looking for a comfortable place to wait for his ride and get a jump on his homework, this is a good option for him.

**ANNUAL APPEAL:** Many thanks to those who have responded. For clarity, I offer the following:

**BOOK STORE**: All school supplies will be available for purchase, as well as St. Paul's apparel. Hours?



**COGNIA STEM CERTIFICATION:** Following the successful COGNIA accreditation of our academic



program in the fall, Joe and Trevor decided to seek COGNIA's unique and separate STEM certification — which evaluates our commitment to and implementation of science, technology, engineering, and math at SPS. Few schools earn this prestigious certification. After rigorous evaluation (and lots of paperwork and ZOOM meetings), COGNIA happily granted full accreditation in the areas of STEM. I am most grateful to Joe and Trevor for pursuing this additional layer of validity to our academic program! Special thanks, too, to the parents who participated in the interview process: Kathy Oubre, Mark Smith, Neal Hightower, James Seese, Letha Tepper, Sean Roberts, Tara Peltier, Jade Rung & Jeanne Lea.

To quote the lead COGNIA evaluator, "We found it very difficult to find any area of improvement to recommend to your school." Their suggested "improvement list" included:

## 1. Continue to do what you are doing.

- 2. Continue to collect data on the results of your programs so that five years from now you will be ready for your next certification.
- 3. Consider including girls in some of your extracurricular STEM offerings (I am not yet ready for this one!)
  - 4. Celebrate your successes.

And so we will continue to celebrate! Again, SPS takes the lead! Your sons are getting an outstanding education! Spread the word!

**DRIVING:** I call the following to your attention:

- **SAFE DRIVING:** Parents –let's start 2022 with a resolution for safe driving! Set an example for the students! Students the neighbors are watching (and filming!) and we will take action! **RE-REGISTRATION OF STUDENTS FOR 2022 - 23** Yes, it is time to start thinking about next year! We will begin registering current students for 2022-23. Here's the process:

- Current 8<sup>th</sup> graders will be asked to register during the last week of January. Paperwork will be emailed to you on Monday of this week. You will have ten days to complete the registration or let us know that your son will not be returning to this Blue Ribbon School. We need to know if any current 8<sup>th</sup> graders do not plan on returning next year in order for us to know how many new (if any) 9<sup>th</sup> graders we can accept.
- Current 9<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> grade students will be asked to register during the first week of February.
- Current 12<sup>th</sup> graders well, they don't have to worry about registering for SPS next year!
- In all re-registration for 2022 23, a \$300 registration fee will be due.



**SLOW YOUR ROLL.** This week is the one-year anniversary of Mayor Mark Johnson's initiative to improve driving habits within Covington – one of his main campaign pledges. Did you know:

- About the film: A suicide attempt left 16-year-old varsity cheerleader, Emma Benoit, paralyzed, but propelled her on a mission to use her painful experience to help others find hope, and shine more light on the fact that 20 young people die every day by suicide in the in the United States. My Ascension is a feature length documentary that chronicles Emma's inspiring journey and quest to walk again, as she works to bring Hope Squad, a school-based suicide prevention program, to Louisiana.
