




Habitat for Humanity

Saint Paul's Marian Players opened their spring musical, "How to Succeed in Business (Without Really Trying)" on Wednesday, March 16. Satire is at the heart of this spring musical, a revival of the Broadway hit of 1961, which is based on an early 50's novel. The comedy musical tells the story of a window washer, J. Pierrepont Finch, who uses a self-help book to quickly (and to some, annoyingly) rise to the top of the business world in Manhattan.

Marian Players Director Gordon Carmadelle commented on the musical's satirical themes, saying "Satire is important. It's a way to hold a mirror up to how things are, or how things used to be. This show

uses a lot of humor to do it, and it's because we recognize how things were that we can laugh a bit at it now. Shows like *Mad Men* do a great job at reminding us how unequal things were for men and women in typical offices of the 1960s, and *How to Succeed* does it with songs and a smile, in a much less serious tone. It's because we've come so far in terms of office equality that we can laugh some at how things were, but it also reminds us of how far we still have to go. The show has such great and memorable songs to go along with a very light-hearted approach to the story. It's also a great learning experience for our young men and ladies about a time period that can teach them so much about how people attempted to co-exist in workplaces and gives them a humorous look at what not to do as well."

The cast that includes students from Saint Paul's and St. Scholastica Academy and the play takes place in the Alumni Memorial Theater. Cast members include: Zachary Van Zandt as J. 






Saint Paul's Story - Great Graduation Gift!
