Comprehensive Standardized Testing Program:

Below is a list of the standardized tests required for every student to take by grade level.

- Prefreshmen: PreACT⁸
 - PreACT⁸ will be administered in February of Pre-freshmen year
- Freshmen: PreACT⁹
 - PreACT⁹will be administered in February of Freshman year
- Sophomores: PreACT
 - PreACT is administered in February of Sophomore year
 - Select students will also take the PSAT
- Juniors: ACT
 - Students can elect to take the PSAT to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program
 - ACT is administered during school in the spring of Junior year
- Seniors: ACT and ASVAB
 - Students take ACT/SAT according to their individual strengths for college entrance requirements
 - ACT is administered during school day in the fall of Senior year
 - ASVAB is administered in spring of senior year
