Alumni Profile

Cameron Robichaux '13



What is your favorite memory at Saint Paul's? Despite winning 2 State Championships, and setting the school record in the pole vault, my favorite memory at Saint Paul's was the Track and Field team winning the District Championship by 1/2 point my senior year. Every single point and every member of the team was necessary to win. All of our hard work, countless hours of practice, and sweating in the spring heat paid off when we were handed the trophy late that night. A special shout out to Zachary Albright who anchored the 4x400m relay, the last event, scoring 1 point securing the victory. That one point left us the 1/2 point lead over Ponchatoula High School who won the 4x400m relay. I keep the celebratory photo with the whole team in my office still

Do you have any other family members currently attending or who have attended Saint Paul's? My two brothers, Jared '09 and Spencer '07 Robichaux attended Saint Paul's as well as my father Craig Robichaux '78. Additionally, my uncle, Wayne Pechon '78 and cousins, Trent '10 and Brendan Pechon '08 also attended Saint Paul's.

Education: Bachelor of Science in Psychology from Louisiana State University; Juris Doctor in Civil Law from Loyola University New Orleans, College of Law

Who was your favorite or most impactful teacher? My favorite teacher was not actually my teacher, but rather the principal, Brother Raymond Bulliard, FSC. Brother Ray guided the students by recognizing their accomplishments for any task imaginable at assemblies, serving lunch where he greeted everyone by name and asked how your family was doing, and by giving countless speeches on new words and how the words should help us be better men. For example, we should recognize an afflatus to be salubrious men and not act in deleterious ways. Aside from his general care for each student, his speeches on irregular pearl (Baroque) music taught us about the change of seasons with Vivaldi, and welcomed Jesus near Christmas with Handel. He always transitioned us through the school year and helped us focus on what matters in life. He always reminded us that we are the building blocks of the edifice of the mystical Lord our God. He repeated at the end of each assembly, the light of the candle is extinguished, but what it represents, the love of God, will never be extinguished. These are the lessons that I use far more than calculus on any given day.

What advice would you give to current students or young alumni? I will give the same advice I received in 8th grade -- get involved! If you see a club, team, or extracurricular activity that intrigues you, get involved. You will be amazed at the lifelong friends you may meet over a shared hobby, or memories you will share with your Saint Paul's brothers.



Why do you continue to support the Saint Paul's mission? I credit Saint Paul's as a formative experience in my life helping to transition from childhood to adulthood. Much of the professional success can be attributed to lessons learned both academically, socially, and spiritually. I support Saint Paul's so it can continue to do the same for aspiring young men.

Why would you encourage young men to consider attending Saint Paul's? Saint Paul's is a great place to grow up. The North Shore is blessed with an abundance of quality schools, but none compare to Saint Paul's academically or the lasting brotherhood it provides. The memories I share with my classmates and fellow alumni all lead back to Saint Paul's being a great place to grow up.

What would you describe as your greatest takeaway from Saint Paul's? At ten years out, my greatest takeaway is the memories I have. Saint Paul's was an integral part in allowing me to become a lawyer through its excellent education. It was transformative in assisting in maturing me and building a solid spiritual and moral base, which I fall back on often; however, nothing beats the memories of sitting under the various pavilions spending time with my friends.

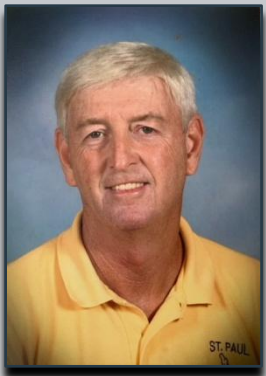

Mr. Jon Craig, AFSC, long-time Saint Paul's faculty member passed away after a lengthy illness. Jon was a legend at Saint Paul's, having begun his teaching career here in 1978 as a biology teacher. He quickly "rose in the ranks" to the position of Science Department Chair, revamping the science curriculum, improving teacher and student accountability, and inserting innovative and relevant teaching methods. In the mid-1990's, computers were becoming the rage, and Jon was a driving force in keeping Saint Paul's abreast of the latest. He switched from science teaching to the first ever Technology Director, installing the first school-wide computer network, helping decide what platforms would be used, and learning all he could to help teachers adapt and incorporate the latest in technology into their lesson plans. Jon was so influential that he was awarded one of the first Brother Charles Crouzet Awards and eventually would be honored by the Brothers of the Christian Schools as an Affiliated Member of the Institute in recognition of his devotion to Lasallian education at Saint Paul's School. Jon is survived by his wife Kathleen, daughter Kathy, son-in-law Mike Holmes, Saint Paul's current Technology Director, and grandchildren Kristen and Jonathan Holmes.



Mr. Mike McMurry, Class of 1963 and long time employee in Saint Paul's Finance Office, passed away on Saturday, October 22. During his time as a student, Mike was an outstanding student and athlete – especially on the basketball court. Among his many athletic accomplishments, Mike was honored as a Saint Paul's 1000 point shooter during his high school basketball career. Additionally, he was a recipient of the Jimmy Dunn Award which is awarded to the best overall athlete and was inducted into Saint Paul's Athletic Hall of Fame. Following his college graduation, Mike came to work in Saint Paul's Finance Office as an accountant. For many years, he assisted the CFOs with keeping excellent financial records and helping the Presidents insure the financial stability of the school. When the Brothers' Provincial headquarters moved to Covington, Mike went to work for the Brothers, again in his role as accountant. For the past few years, Mike has been a victim of Lou Gehrig's disease (ALS), which ultimately claimed his life. A few years ago, he appeared at a President's assembly and with a computer-aided voice program, addressed the students – encouraging them to accept the trials in their lives, to love their time at Saint Paul's, and to never abandon their faith in Almighty God. Mike is survived by his wife Deidre, son Michael, Class of 1993, and many other family members and friends.

In 2012, at the bequest and generosity of the estate of Mr. Harry G. Friedman, Class of 1933, a memorial plaque was designed and hung in the Eastern hallway in the lobby of LaSalle Hall. It was dedicated to the Memory of Mr. Harry Friedman and that of his brother, USA Lt. Col. Joseph Bernard Friedman, Saint Paul's College 1935. Additional language on the plaque is as follows: *"Honoring the memory of all the Saint Paul's Alumni who practiced the values learned at Saint Paul's by their patriotic service in the United States Military."*

Over 200 Alumni are presently represented on the plaque which resides in the hallway of La Salle Hall adjacent to our former ROTC classroom. 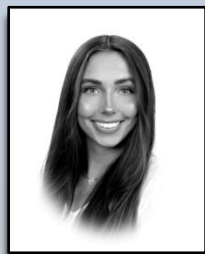

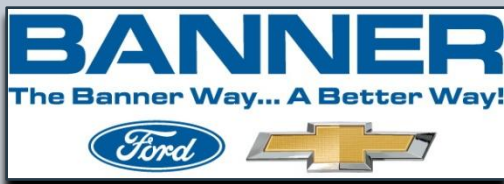

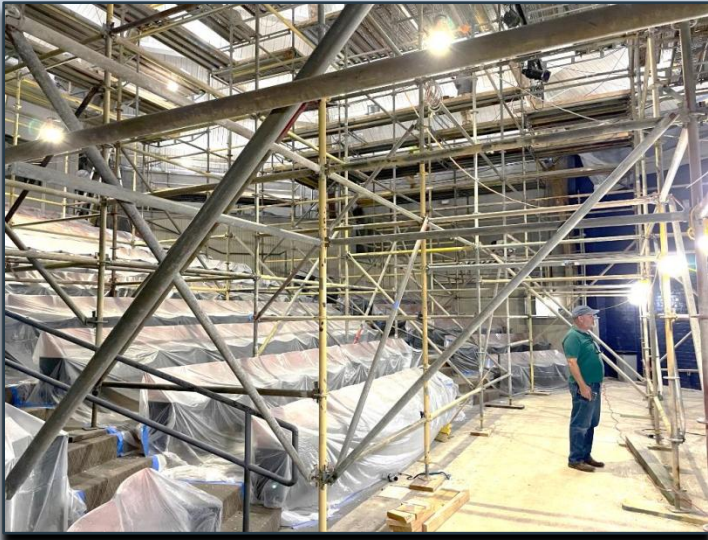

Saint Paul's 116 Year Old Theater



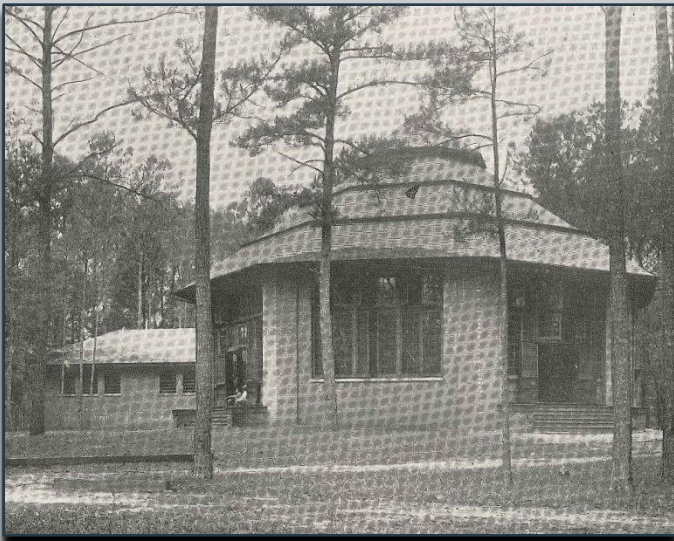

Saint Paul's theater sustained damage from Hurricane Ida last year. The structural engineer theorized that a microburst hit the building and dislodged some of the support structures. Emergency, but temporary, repairs were made to allow use of the building for the remainder of last school year. Upon further review, the engineer discovered additional needs that may or may not have been caused by the storm. The 116 years old facility is showing its age.

In addition to the structural repairs, cosmetic changes are being made which include: masonry repairs to storm damaged walls and pointed up old mortar joints where needed; enclose several windows in the backstage area that are no longer

needed; paint the interior and exterior; repairs to damaged drainage pipes and relocation of backstage sinks; repairing of subfloor issues found in the basement; and replacement of the roof. We are currently in negotiation with the insurance company to cover the expense of the roof; however, they only want to patch it. We will eventually replace the roof whether the insurance covers it or not.

Finally, the building once again has bats. This has been a recurring problem. We hope to make it "bat-proof" during the renovation project. Interested in helping with expenses to repair our beloved theater? [Click HERE.](#)



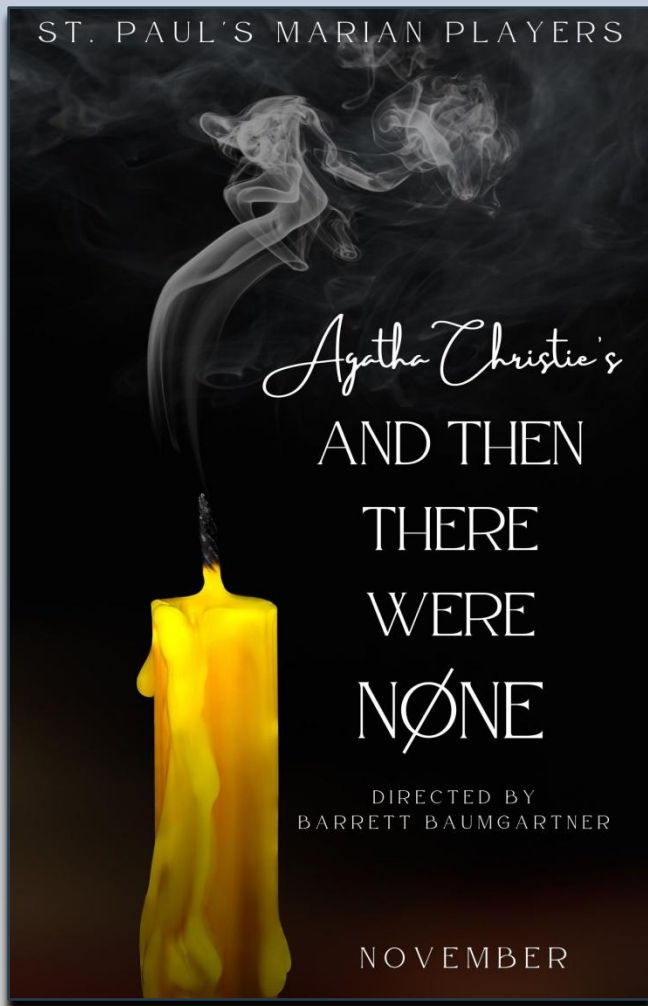
