I. Write your answers in your own words. For each answer, also include text support in the form of direct quotations from the novel, citing author and page number.

- 1. This novel is considered a *bildungsroman*, or a novel that deals with the growth and development of a young person. Explain how it fits this definition.
- 2. Explain how Huck's perception of Jim as a person changes as the story progresses.
- 3. The novel is presented in *episodes*, self-contained stories with their own conflicts and resolutions, which are divided by Huck's and Jim's travels on the river. Which episode was your least favorite? Explain why.
- 4. As the episodes progress, what seems to set apart the experiences on land and on the river?
- 5. What is one threat that Huck and Jim face?
- 6. What purpose do the characters the Duke and King serve? Do you ever get tired of their presence in the story?
- 7. What purpose does Tom Sawyer serve in the story? Do you ever get tired of HIS presence in the story?
- 8. Twentieth century writer Ernest Hemingway commented "All modern American literature comes from one book by Mark Twain called *Huckleberry Finn*." What makes this novel so great that it influenced literature into the next century?
- 9. Do you think that this novel, which was written during the late 1800's, is relevant today? Why or why not?
- 10. What do you think Huck will do next? Don't forget to include text support.
