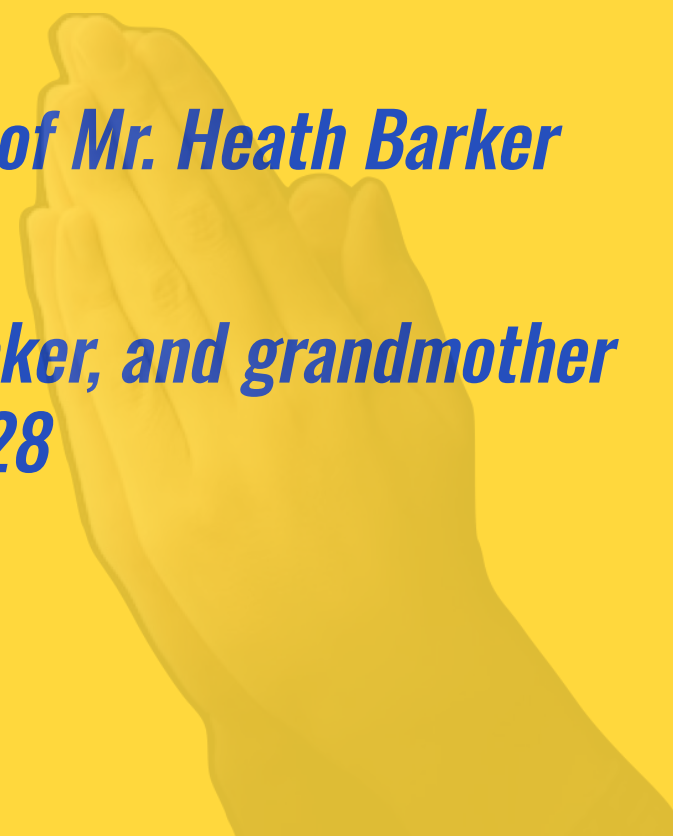

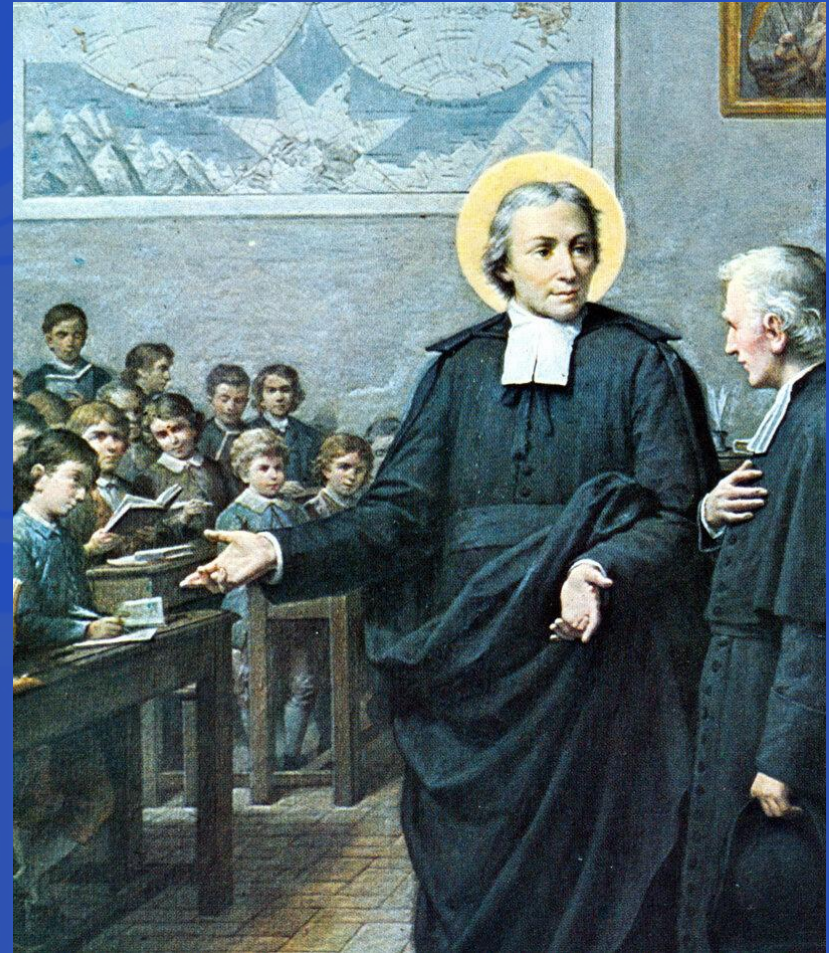
Examinations

James Geisler placed 10th Overall and 4th in Sporting Clays



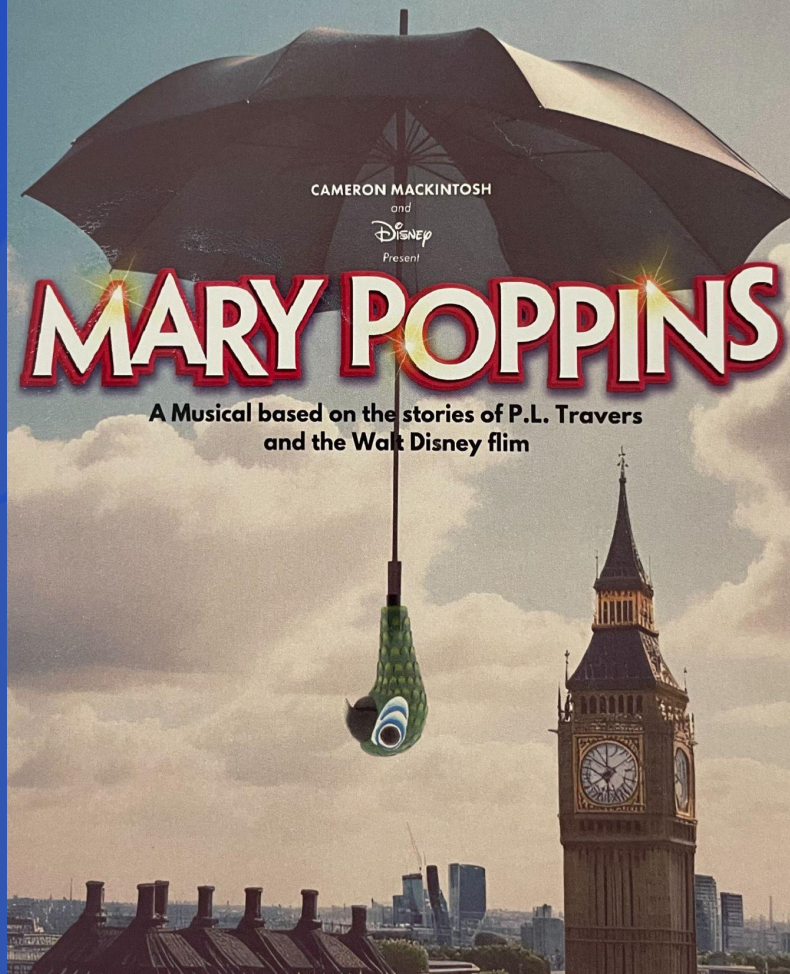
ALUM WINS 2025 CRESCENT CITY CLASSIC
