


JEAN MOËT & PERRETTE LESPAGNOL





While the first meet did not score the teams, Hammond proved to be quite hospitable to the Running Wolves with the JH earning a 1st place finish at the Trafton Academy/ BSN Sports invitational and the Varsity earning a 1st place finish at the 2025 Saint Thomas/Rollette- Chiropractic Invitational.
